

Radinm as the Earth's Heat Supply.

It is probable that the presence of heat producing radium in the earth will prolong that cooling process from which scientists predict the ultimate death of our planet. Professor John Joly, of the University of Dublin, writes in the February Harper's of "Radium and the Earth's Internal Heat," explaining the latest calculations of the earth's age with respect to the quantity of radium still existing within it. 
