the most interesting of all the city's womankind They are as a rule bright and sparkling, of good appearance, good miads and genuine culture.



What Japan pays for Life. (Cleveland Leader.)

If a Japanese has no more than \$500 a year for his entire income the government of his country demands and takes only 17 per cent of it. It leaves him about \$415 for himself and his family.

But if a Japanese has \$50,000 a year-an immense income in his country-1: must give up about 63 per cent to the government. Then he actually pays an income tax of acout \$31,500. All that is left for him is about \$18,500.

That does not tell the whole story. Eg .. erything is taxed in Japan. The indirect as well as the direct burdens of government are numerous and heavy. It is impossible




