A. E. Hanson Is Sentenced To Jail.

In the Fredericton police court Thursday morning Colonel Marsh passed sentence upon A. E. Hanson for assault upon Mr. O. S. Crocket, M. P., last month. The sentence is that Hanson be imprisoned in the county jail for one month and that he pay costs, amounting to \$55 and that in the event of his refusal to pay costs he be imprisoned in the county jail for another month in addition to the sentence already imposed. Hanson was not present in court and is said to be out of the city. Mr. R. W. McLellan gave notice of appeal. Colonel Marsh in receiving the notice stated that bonds would have to be given for Hanson and that they would have to be signed at once or else officers would be sent after him. His Honor commented strongly in giving judgment and said that Hanson's assault was unjustifiable and done solely to publicly disgrace Mr. Crocket. He also stated that members of parliament must be protected.

Painful Accident.

C. A. Lindow received severe injuries from an accidental fall Saturday sustained while discharging his duties as C. P. R. station agent. During the afternoon he was examining the contents of cars on the C. P. R. wharf. In closing a car door with one hand, having the other in his pocket, the door suddenly stopped and he was thrown from his balance, falling from the platform to the floor below. The fall resulted in the fracture of his left arm in two places and one finger on his right hand, as well as quite severe cuts on his head. He hit close beside an opening in the wharf and was in danger of falling into the river before he was able to regain his feet and made his way to his home. — St. Stephen Courier.

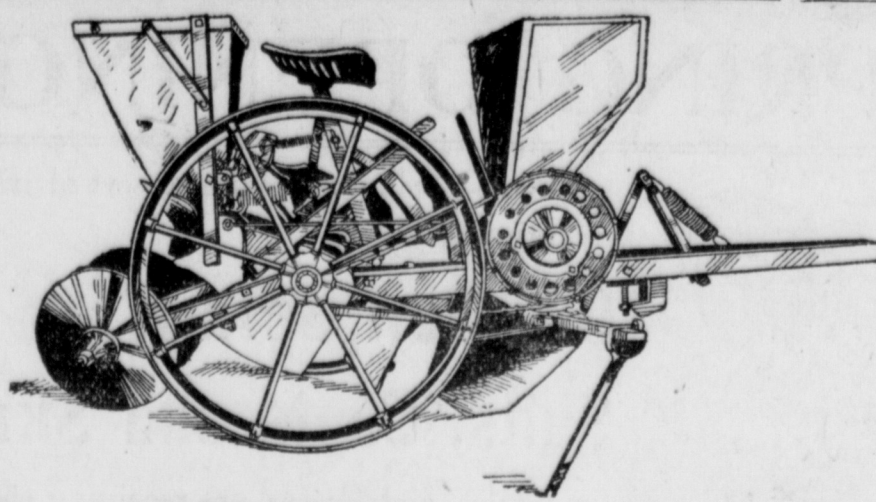

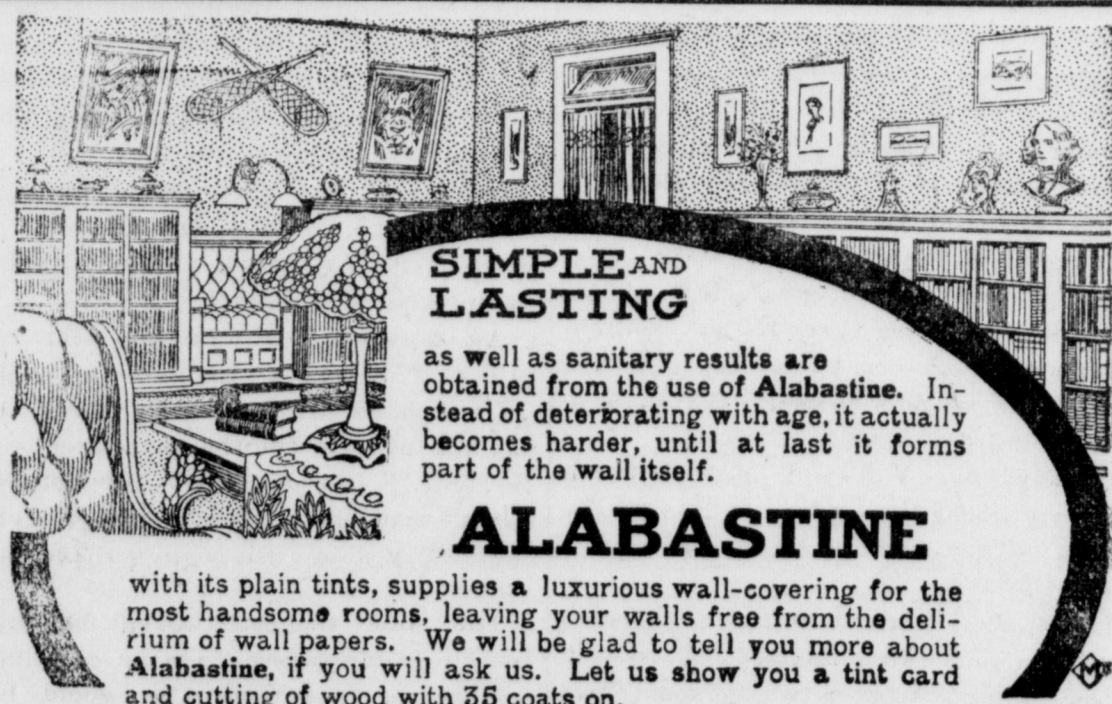
