#### Lecture on Forestry.

James Lawlor, of the Ontario Forestry Department, who is here to attend the Forestry Convention to be held in Fredericton on Feb 23 and 24, gave his first lecture in this province last Tuesday in the Theatre on the Conservation of our resources. The lecture was given under the auspices of the Canadian Club. Rev. G. D. Ireland, the chairman, and J. C. Hartley, were on the platform with the speaker. There was a fair sized aud-

Mr. Lawlor illustrated his lecture with a number of fine stereoptican views. The area of the forests of Canada, he said, has been very much over estimated. Very much of the timber is not merchantable except for firewood. The best estimates for the amount of merchantable tumber are at from one-third to one-half that of the United States.

A very generous estimate places the available supply at 532 billion feet board measure. This seems an enormous quantity, but at the present rate of consumption this would last the United States only 12 years, or England, which is a more careful user, 60 years. He said that New Brunswick had 7,750,000 acres in Crown Lands, on which was received in stumpage, \$450,000.

So well are the forests in the OEF Country preserved that Prussia's net revenue on seven million acres is seventeen million dollars a year, Saxony has 400,000 acres. Ontario as still in the possession of the Crown, 116 080,000 acres, or 290 times as much. The forest revenues of Saxony and Ontario are about equal, while the area is being increased on the former country and decreased on the

#### Lord Acerdeen's Telegram.


