



The same day it is roasted, the coffee is crushed and put up in pound and half-pound doubly-sealed air tight tins.

Oaly one grade of coffee will be put on the market, and it will be a grade to appeal to particular people. With coffee, as with tea Mr. Estabrooks will adhere to the principal of quality goods.
