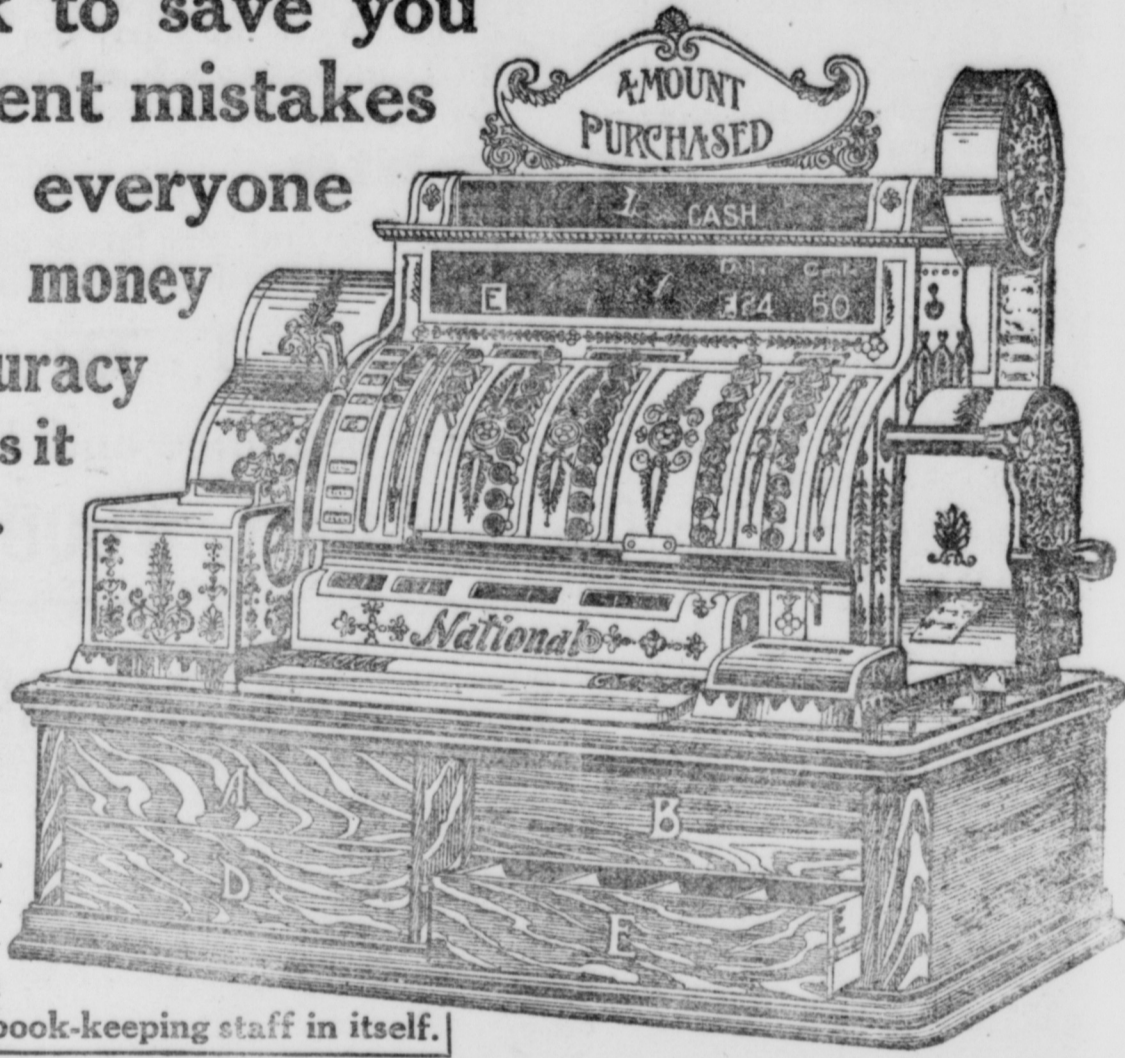

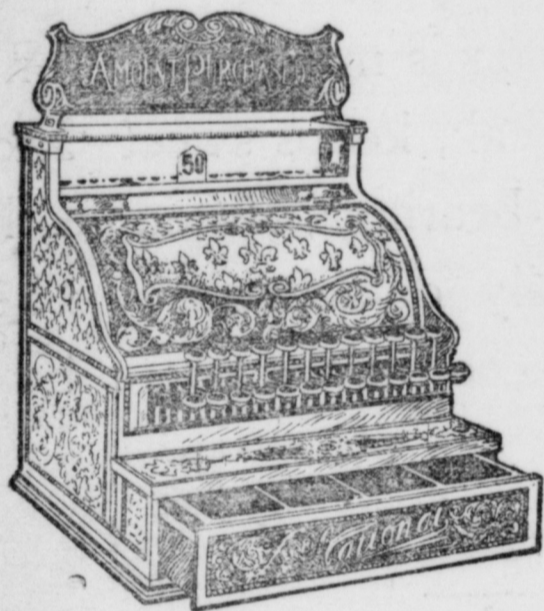

Professor Uppvall will enter on his new duties on Sept 1 next. He will be much missed in the university, where his work has met with every approval.

### Aeroplane Alarms British Officers

London, May 6—A day or two ago the fleet of British warships anchored off Sheerness had a novel experience when an aeroplane from the Aero Club suddenly appeared out of the haze and manoeuvred over the vessels at varying heights. After making a deliberate reconnaissance the aerial craft disappeared from view.

The aeroplane which started the navy officers is a Wright model and was piloted by Cecil Grace. After leaving the harbor it flew nearly fifty miles in fifty-one minutes, rising at one time to a height of 1,500 feet.

### Fatality on Electric Railroad

Springfield, Ohio, May 6th—Two men were killed and nine persons severely injured late last night in a wreck on the Ohio Electric Railroad near Urban. W. H. Ferguson, a motorman and M. M. Roake of this city were killed when a freight car broke away from a trolley express car and plunged down a steep grade into a passenger car. The injured include two women.

Tokio, May 6—Aomori, a flourishing seaport on the north shore of the main island of Japan was visited today by a conflagration which destroyed two-thirds of the town. The census of 1900 gave Aomori a population of 15,000.

### Canadian Parliament Prorogued.

WILL RE ASSEMBLE NOV 10th.

The second session of the eleventh parliament has come to an end. The prorogation ceremonies were of an unusually interesting nature owing to the fact that this is the last occasion of a meeting between Earl Grey and the parliament of Canada. After the formal ceremonies had been concluded a formal address of felicitation was extended to Earl Grey. In his reply, his excellency expressed genuine regret that his stay in Canada was terminated. During his official residency, he had traveled all over this country, and he could speak as one having first hand knowledge, and he predicted that in this century the Dominion would be the "granary and heart and soul and rudder of the Empire."  
Speaker Macleod gave out that parliament would meet again on Nov 10th.

### A World Breaker Pedestrian at Seventy-two.

Edward Payson Weston at the ripe old age of 72 years, has just completed a walking tour from Los Angeles to New York a distance of 3,483 miles in seventy-seven walking days, and was presented with a gold championship belt and \$400 in cash on his arrival last Monday in the latter city. He has received hundreds of offers from vaudeville managers who wish to exhibit him as a physical wonder, but though in very modest circumstances, Weston has declined them all.
