



John D. McNaughton, New Liskeard, Ont. : A young man not belonging here, and suffering from, it is believed, consumption, is being kept by one of the hotels here. He has no means and has been refused admission to our hospital. The conditions where he is offer him no chance. Could he be admitted to your Free Hospital for Consumptives? If not, could you inform me where he can be sent, and what steps are necessary to secure prompt admittance? NOT A SINGLE PATIENT HAS EVER BEEN

#### REFUSED ADMISSION TO THE MUSKOKA FREE HOSPITAL BECAUSE OF HIS OR HER INABILITY TO PAY.

Since the hospital was opened in April, 1902, one thousand five hundred and twenty-four patients have been treated in this one institution, representing people from every province in the Dominion. For the week ending November 20th, 1909, one hundred and twentyfive patients were in residence. Ninety-six of these are not paying a copper for their maintenance—absolutely free. The other twenty-nine paid from \$2.00 to \$4.90 a week. No one pays more than \$4.90.

Suitable cases are admitted promptly on completion of appli-

flour, four teaspoonfuls of baking powder and one-half teaspoonful of salt. Work in two tablespoonfuls of butter with tips of fingers and add gradually three-forths of a cupful of milk. mixing quickly with a case knife. Cut out and bake in a quick oven.

Luncheon Rolls.

Toss a baking-powder mixture on a floured board and pat and roll to one fourth of an inch in thickness keeping in rectangular shape. Brush over with melted butter and sprinkle with two tablespoonfuls of sugar mixed with one-half teaspoonful of cinnamon, one-third of a cupful of stoned raisions cut in small pieces and two tablespoonfuls of nutmeats. Roll like a jelly-roll and cut off pieces three-fourths of an inch in thickness. Place on a buttered tin, cut side up and bake in a hot oven fifteen minutes.


'Any book in particular, sir?' asked the young woman in charge of the book counter of a large departmental store. 'Thisis a great novel-'

#### Of Interest To N. B. Fruit Growers.

The Provincial Department of Agriculture through A. G. Turney, Horticulturist, is prepared to astist all those who wish advice in regard to planting apple, plnm, and cherry trees or small fruits in the spring of 1911 if they will write him at Fredericton stating particulars in regard to sits and soil upon which it is intended to plant, what crops are growing thereon this summer, whether the orchard is intended chiefly for home use or for market and stating any special preference for certain varieties of apples, etc.

With a knowledge of these particulars, Mr Turney will be able to give the enquirer advice based upon his study of conditions and the sutibility of varieties to the various parts of the Province. He will also undertake to place and personally select any orders sent to him from the very best stock grown in the province. so long as the supply lists and after that from reliable Canadian firms elsewhere. By taking this course the purchasers may avoid planting undesirable varieties and loss through miscepresentation and mistaken advice from unreliable agents. It's urged that orders for 1911 be placed as early as possible this year so that the stock may be early selected and only the best trees taken. Later orders will, of course, have to be filled from what is left after selected s ock is booked.
