The Kaisers Dictum

Much iun has been poked by the comic press at the temperance lecturer-usually represented as a sort of scare crow clad in seedy black, but such representations will in future be lese majeste, for His Imperial Ma jesty the Kalser has joined the much despis ed fraternity. Several times during the past year or two he has taken occasion to warn his people-especially students and workingmen-regarding the dangers attend ing 'excessive' beer drinking, and has advoca ted outdoor sports, after the fashion of the English and American peoples, as a healthy counter attraction. He has now, it appears gone a step further. In opening a new navai academy the other day, we are told, 'he coun seled total abstinence, suggested that the young men join the Good Templars, and ad ded that the nation which in the future used the smallest amount of alcohol would march at the head of the column on the fields of art and war.' The suggestion that the naval ca dets join the Good Templars is perhaps one of the most radical ever made by a European sovereign. The society is one of the very strictest of temperance organizations, its in ternational platform being; 'Total abstinence for the individual and prohibition for the state.' Though it gained footing in Contin ental Europe almost half a century ago the society has only been established in Ger many during the last few years. It's 'secret' character at first gave rise to departmental suspicion, but the government has recently given much support to its work, and has en couraged its international convention to meet in Hamburg next year. German beer drinking has often been lauded as much su perior to total abstinence, but some of the wisest men in the Fatherland have warned the people against the custom Von Moltke said that 'Beer was a far more dangerous enemy to Germany than all the armies of France,' and scientists are lending their weight to the teetotal propaganda. -There are now in Germany about a hundred and fifty thousand organized abstiners. and the liquor trace is said to be getting quite ner yous and taking measures to 'educate' the peo ple as to the 'value of alcohol.' It interesting to note that the Kaiser believes that total ab stinence should be of benefit to the navy At one time the sailors' 'grog' . was supposed to be an absolute necessity. Its use is diminishing in the British navy among officers and men; that bluff sailor, Lord Charles Beresford, expressing the general verdict in declaring himself much more fit without it. Perhaps the Kaiser was led to advocate total abstinence among his sailors by noting that Canada's navy is totally unprovided with grog tubs. The Kaiser is certainly wise in declar ng, in effect, that the nation that drinks least will accomplish most. We wonder what effect this new move of the terrible Germans will have on the war scare in England. Will the 'House of Brewers' launch a total abstin ence crusade in the interest of national effi ciency ? W. the 'National Review' and the Observer' denounce the government for its. failure to decree that every man should be come a Good Templar so as to meet on equa terms the Kaiser's 'iron hearted men .

New Brunswick Apples Make A Hit At Toronto

Reporting the horticultural show held on the week of 14th November at Toronto by the Ontario Fruit Growers' Association, the weekly Mail and Empire of the 22nd inst makes the following remarks upon some special features of the show.



Amber

(Hasper's Weekly) Although amber has been found in differentiplaces, its only important centre is the coast of the Batis. According to Plinp, the elder, the "sap" was produced in the islands of the "northern sea," and worked there by the natives in the early days.

Shen Nero sent Juli ous, the man who managed his gladiatorial matches, to procura the precious product, the horseman detailed by Julianus for the hard part of the commission, came back with amber in quantities so lavish that even the netting used as protection against wild beasts was fastened with amber buttons. 80.00

Germany first conceded the right to mine and to use the amber on the shores of the Baltic Ses, in return for 40,000 kilograms of crude amber to be delivered annually. But as the profits of the concessionists were great, the German Government increased the consideration of the concession to 87,500 kilos crude amber per annum. Since 1866 that amount has been increased, and the companies working the concession have made an annual delivery of 200,000 kilos per annum in payment for their privilege.

Amber is the result of a disease. The first forest that exuded gum was a sick for est; a pathological case produced amber as another pathological case produces pearls.

KIMBERLEY YIELDS 11 TONS OF GEMS.

This Has Been the Output Since Diamonds Were Found in South Africa in 1871.

The day's work at the mine was over and Frederick Wells, the surface manager, was making his usual rounds Glancing along one side of the deep excavation his eye suddenly caught the gleam of an object far up the bank. He lost no time in climbing up to the spot where he had noted the glint of light. He had not been mistaken, says the Christian Herald: it was a brilliant crystal. He tried to pull it out with his fingers, and, as this proved impossible he sought to pry it out with the blade of his penknife. To his surprise the blade of the knife broke without causing the stone to yield. Then he knew it was a large stone. So large and brilliant was the stone that he feared he was either dream ing or was insane.

Determined to test the stone on the spot before proceeding further. Wells rubbed ff the dirt from one of its faces with his fingers and soon convinced himself that it was not a lump of glass, but a diamond apparently o exceptional whiteness and purity. He finally succeeded in prying out the stone and bore it away with him to the office of the mine. Here it was cleaned and, to the astonishment of all, was found to have a weight of 3022 carats, more than three times that of any other diamond that has been discovered Before many hours passed the telegraph carried tidings to all parts of the world that the greatest diamond of this age, or any other age, hae been brought to light. It has been thirty-nine years. July 13th 1871. since the discovery of diamonds in South Africa. Do you know how these great mines were discovered?. A trader stopping over night with a Dutch farmer saw the children playing with bright marbles. The trader took the white stones to Cape Town and found they were diamonds of wonderful beauty and great value. In these thirty-nine years about eleven tons of diamonds have been taken from the Kimberley mines. Think of eleven tons of diamonds, like eleven tons of coal being dumped into your cellar.
