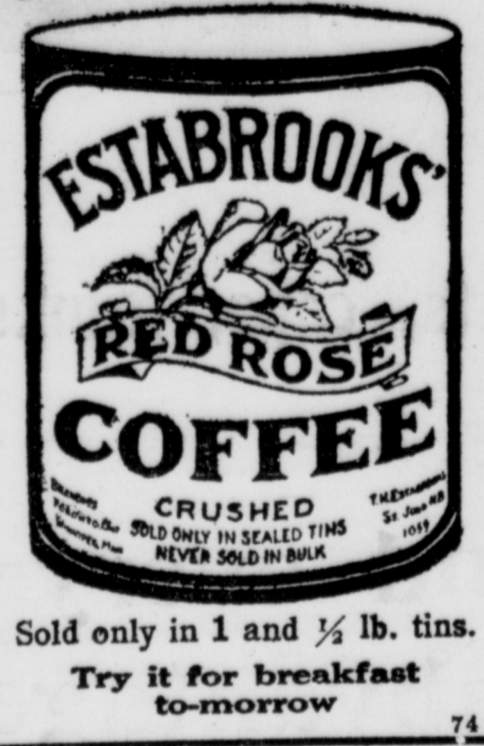

**Fredericton Business College in new Quarters Sept 1st**

As a result of the extensive improvements being made to the Inches building at the corner of York and Queen Streets, the Fredericton Business College at present located in the Pitts Block on York Street, will have quarters second to none in the Maritime Provinces, and surpassed by none in Canada. The school will incidentally be located once more in the building in which it was first organized in 1894. Since that time it has been located in the Golden Fleeces building and the Pitts Block.

The new quarters of the Business College will be on the third floor of the Inches Block. The situation itself could hardly be bettered, the windows giving an excellent view of Queen Street, Phoenix Square, the grounds of the Provincial Normal School and the river. The new quarters are to be occupied by Sept 1st.

**MAGNIFICENT QUARTERS**

The third floor of the Inches building is being entirely remodelled. When the alterations are completed there will be several large and commodious class rooms, divided from one another by glass partitions. There will also be a separate office for the principal Mr. W. J. Osborne, located at the right of the main stairway. The toilet rooms will be in the extension of the Inches block which faces York Street. Another storey is being added to this part of the building, and doors cut through the rear walls of the latter to make the necessary connection between the two.

**MODERN IMPROVEMENTS**

Hardwood floors are to be laid throughout all that part of the building which is to be occupied by the business College. Steel ceilings are also to be used. The walls of the college premises will be finished in bu-lap.

**VENTILATION AND HEATING**

Particular attention has been devoted to the heating and ventilation of the new premises, both being particularly important in connection with schools or similar establishments. The ventilation of the new premises will be by two chimneys which are to be used no longer as chimneys. Summer and winter ventilators are to be installed. The Business College will have its own heating apparatus. A combined hot water and hot air system is to be used and it is calculated to keep the temperature comfortable at all times. Electric lights are to be installed throughout the rooms.

**FINE RECORD OF INSTITUTIONS**

In the past the Fredericton Business College has achieved a position in the forefront of the business-teaching institutions of Canada. It will no doubt continue to advance under the direction of its present energetic principal and with the further advantage of being located in magnificent quarters. The school on account of being situated in the educational centre of the Province of New Brunswick has an advantage possessed by none other.

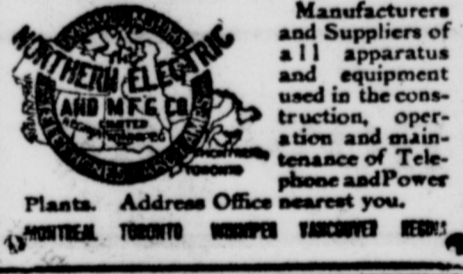

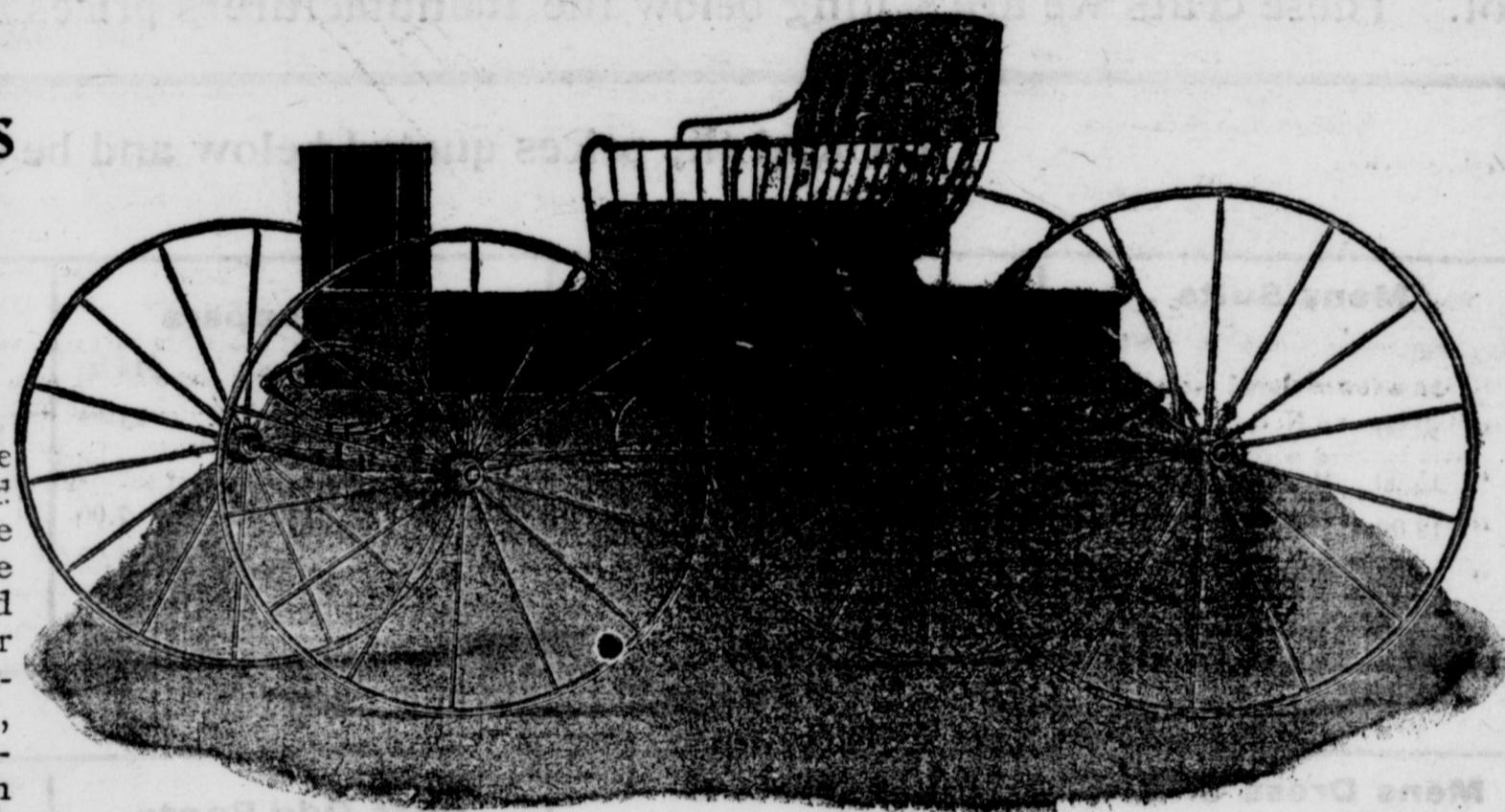

**BIG ST JOHN SHOW NEARING COMPLETION.**

Great Deal of Work Has Been Done Quickly and Effectively.

The educational value of the Dominion Exhibition to be held in St. John, N. B., will be unusual as it will bring together for the first time in eastern Canada a concise representation of the wealth of the Dominion in all its resourceful departments. Aside from this the entertainment features will surpass anything yet attempted in the east. The new buildings, extension of the grounds, elaboration of the parent buildings and the exposition of live stock, agricultural products and industrial wares from all sections of the continent will be a revelation to all visitors.

At the time of writing nearly all the space in the buildings has been taken up, although there will be some few allotments for the late comers, but from the standpoint of exhibitors the show is already assured of success. All that remains now to be done is the placement of all displays and arrangements for the grand opening, the details of programme and the decorating of the whole group of buildings.

It is certain now the live stock display will eclipse all former exhibitions in St. John, the agricultural and dairying departments are also fast filling up, the horse show will be a big feature in itself, and the poultry, pet stock, fruit section, etc. will be more comprehensive than usual. Outside exhibitors are contracting with St. John people for the erection of their booths, a small army of men are rushing the new buildings to completion, and these will be followed by another detachment of workers who will put the finishing touches on the whole plant.

**THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT.**

The reason for the Duke of Connaught's popularity is difficult to define, says a London Correspondent of the N. Y. Sun. It consists chiefly in his personal magnetism and charming manner. He is said to have been Queen Victoria's favorite son as Princess Henry of Battenberg was her favorite daughter. He is now a man of 60, far more distinguished and royal looking Edward VII. was, with snow white hair and mustache and a superb carriage. He is very democratic and his children are like him in this respect, so that the Connaught parties are free from the etiquette and restriction which renders royal functions wearisome as a rule. No one can point to any particular act of brilliancy or merit on the Duke's part, but he is the typical English gentleman, brave kindly, a good sportsman, a straight shot and a hard rider. His appearance at any public or official function is a signal for an outburst of applause which is always as enthusiastic as any the late King himself received. The Duchess of Connaught is one of great London hostesses. She is very pretty, always beautifully gowned and decidedly modern in her ideas. She and the present Queen are not altogether in accord on many subjects. The Duchess has always favored Americans and allowed her daughters to choose their girl friends from among the daughters of well known Americans in London. Also she loves a game of bridge and like her husband she interests herself in hunting, golfing, etc.

**Remedies For Tan**

There are several simple remedies, some of which suit one skin, some another. Lemon juice is a harmless bleach, either clear or mixed with rosewater or glycerine, according as it suits your skin. Dab it on after washing your face at night, and let it dry on. Some persons find cucumber juice satisfactory, when the cucumbers are in season. The simple old-fashioned remedy of sour buttermilk is about as good as any. A chemical bleach peroxide of hydrogen, is efficacious and may be mixed with rosewater if it irritates the skin. Do not let it come in contact with the hair. It should be borne in mind that when a bleach is used too frequently, the skin is apt to become tender and more inclined to sunburn. Do not apply any bleach during the day, before going out of doors. It is wise to protect the face by a shade hat, and then only use the bleach to prevent the coat of tan becoming skin deep. A little healthy tan is admired in these days of outdoor life.
