I think the time has come when we should arrive at some disposition of this land and I think if those people will beautify and care for the land, in five or ten years you will be proud to think that you granted their request.

Coun. Melville-A 99 year lease means for all practical purposes the gift of the land. No one except Mr. Shaw spoke of the expendit ure of \$100, for beautifying the premises.

Coun. Shaw-Yesterday the representatives of the Upper Woodstock district said, "we will come under bonds and pay \$100 annually for ten years to beautify the grounds."

Coun. Melville-Coun. Shaw says the ground if no benefit to the school district in dollars and cents. Why would it not be? We have received \$16.00 a year, which was a benefit to this county. We have the lands now and we still occupy them under lease. I would be willing to sell the land, giving the preference to Upper Wood. stock. I was told that Gans said he would give \$1500.00 for the lot. I myself will give more than \$300 for the land.


