Water Too Low For Fall Drives. The only thing that will make a fall-drive possible on the St John River is heavy rain which will continue for some time. There is little hope for that now, but contractor John S Scott who was in charge of the Corp.ration Drive this year is ready to make the attempt to bring more logs out if there is he least chance.

At present 15,000,000 feet is hung up on the upper river. Part of this is in the neigh borhood of Elmunston and part is at Grand Isle. At present the intention is to put on large crews of men and bring the logs out to the St John Lumber Company's booms and sort them there. The logs of that com pany will be ret.ined and the others driven to Van Buren with the intention of hanging hem up for the winter.

The mills in and about St John are expect ed to stop sawing shor: ly, the scare ty of logs being the cause. It is thought that the logs now hung up will come out safely next spring.

Our community was somewhat shocked and many were saddeued, last Wednesday. when the sad intelligence came over the wire, that Mrs J B Roxborough of Bentford, Me, had died suddenly at her home. Dur ing her lifetime she passed many days as an invalid; but through it all she had slways looked above to the All Wise Father. and could say with Christian courage and hope "Thy will be done," Up to Sanday previous to her death, she had been in her usual frail health but from that time she gradually sank, until Wednesday morning, Sep 28, just as the little birds warbled their songs announcing the beginning of a new day, she passed peacefully out into the "Great beyond," leaving a husband, two sons and one daughter, besides three brothers and three sisters to mourn their loss, death being due to heart failure. The remains came by the B & A to Monticello, Me, accompanied by her husband and one son, from thence being conveyed to Carvell, the place of her nativity, where she was laid in her last resting place, Sunday at 2 p m, in the cemetery of that place, the Rev C W Wallen officiating. The text chosen was from II Thess II, 1.

The floral tributes were numerous and expensive, and formed a display of almost ideal beanty, showing the high esteem in whibh the deceased was held by many friends. Mrs Roxborough was formerly Miss Lottie Carvell of Carvell, N B, and had many relatives and friends at that place, as well as in other adjacent villages, who will mourn their loss and revere her memory.
