Sassafras Oil For Mosquito Bites.

It is not generally known how valuable a preventive against the bites of mosquitoes, fleas, gnats, midges and so forth oil of sassafras is. If in a susceptible person the oil is applied at once to the place that has been bitten it almost invariably prevents the poisoning altogether.

If applied to the inflamed spot a day or two after the bite it at once stops the irritation. To those who live in the country and whose life is made a burden by undue susceptibility to insect bites and to those who have not yet returned from holiday making in regions infested by biting insects oil of sassafras should be a great boon, and it is harmless as an external application.—Dietetic and Hygienic Gazette.

Veal And Tomato Salad

Ingredients required are one pint of veal stock in which one tablespoonful of gelatine has been dissolved, four firm large tomatoes, freed from skins, seeds and pulp, and well drained; two egg yolks selected from white shell eggs; juice of one large lemon, one saltspoonful of salt, and one teaspoonful white pepper. Cut tomato into dice and have solid veal stock cut into neat cubes. All materials must be well chilled. Beat egg yolks lightly, add alternately the lemon juice by drops and the olive oil by degrees, stirring in until one cupful of oil has been used, Pepper and salt must be added at beginning. Mix the tomato and veal cubes and pour over the stiff white mayonnaise. Use only pale yolks in making the dressing.

White Herons in New Jersey

A number of white herons have recently made their headquarters at a point near Woodstown, N. J. It is supposed that the birds are making only a temporary stop there on the way to their southern winter home. These are the birds from which aigrettes are obtained. Extinction of the species is feared because the aigrettes can be obtained only when the bird is raising its young, and its death at the hands of the pothunter also means the starving of the young heron. The birds are rather shy and a close approach to them is not easy, but their size and snow white plumage make them easily discernible.

Will Move A Town Twelve Miles

Grand Junction, Col., Aug. 26.—The entire town of Dragon is to be moved twelve miles as a result of the completion of the Uintah Railway.

Dragon, now boasting 600 inhabitants, will be moved bodily on flat cars to Temple, which will be the new town. Houses, railroad shops, stores and all are to be transported. The expense will be heavy but the railroad officials declare that it will be cheaper in the end to have their facilities at Temple.

The Dragon residents are opposing the venture, but if the railroad shops and roundhouses are removed, the rest of the town will follow suit.

Negotiations are in progress for the removal of the roundhouse and other equipment. The new townsite is in Utah and Dragon will no longer be a postoffice in Colorado.
