LONDON, Nov. 7. - A run by foreign small depositors on the Stepenney branch of the National Penny Bank, Ltd., has been accompanied with scenes of excite -

ment over rights for vantage points in the waiting line of those wishing to withdraw their funds. Frequently the police cordon was rushed and broken today, and it was some time before the crowds were under control. So far as can be ascertained, there was no foundation for the rumors which caused the run. The depositors are being paid as rapidly as the cashiers can hand out the money.

The West Island Indies

PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, Nov-7. - The new island which has risen from the sea between here and Venezuela is about three acres in extent, rising out of the water to a height of from 8 to 10" feet. Before the upheaval the depth of water at this spot averaged about twenty feet. The Governor visited the scene on Sunday, but was unable to approach the island very closely as fire was still burning. It continued throughout the day, but at night it seemed to have burned itself out, only smoke rising. It was said to-day that residents of the locality had been able to land on the island.

The opinion is held here that the upheavel was caused by an explosion of oil under anticlinal strata. The island is composed of mud for the most part and there is a distinct smell of oil. It is just off the oil producing district and close to the asphalt deposits.
