The puplic work of women has been insufficiently recognized, and only as 'the wives of their husbands' has honor come upon them-and yet, says the 'We man at Home,' their work in many fields has made history, and is making history. The suggestion of a special order for women will not meet with any great acclamation from women who matter. The disinclination of the outstanding women to be grouped according to their sex is a growing one. In the arts and sciences there is a universal demand on the part of those who have shaken themselves free of the amateur taint as mercury will surely destroy the sense of to be grouped by right of their achievement, and not in a special department apart by virtue of their sex. 
