TEA LOST TO THE AMERICAN MAR KET.

Shanghai, July, 5 .- Deadlock in the green tea business, caused by America's prohib? tion of the importation of colored teas, com tinues and threatens to deprive the American markets of this year's supply.

The tes is unquestionably much purer than ever before, and the Chinese have made great efforts to meet the wishes of Ameri cans, but the buyers decline to purchase un less the Chinese guarantee that the tea is no

This the Chinese decline to do, on the ground that the samples of new teas sent to the American authorities in June should be accepted as evidence.

The sopping of adulteration, they con tend, causing manufacturers to abstain from the century old custom of soloration, will require time. Meantime America should modify the enforcement of the act for thi season on the promise of the guarantee fur nished for next year's teas.

Unless this is done there is little hope that the fifteen mi lion pounds of green teaordinarily sent to America will be snipped.
