Serious Fire

Fire destroyed, Sunday evening 10th the building in Andover near the end of the railroad bridge owned by Mrs. J. A. Perley and occupied by the 67th Regimental Band, the Liberal-Conservatives as a committee headquarters, the Boy Scouts and Herman Jamer as a farm machinery warehouse and sales-room.

The origin of the fire is not known. The flames sprang up quickly and had the roof of the building doomed before the fire was discovered. Both the Andover and Perth apparatus were brought into use. A large crowd gathered quickly and helped remove all the contents of the building. Fortunately there was no wind. Telephone cables were in danger of being melted but escaped uninjured. It was not until the roof had fallen in that the fire was extinguished. The lower part of the building was practically untouched by the flames. The loss has been estimated at about \$600 and is covered by insurance.---Victoria County News

The Los Angeles Dynamiting Case

Los Angeles, Cal., Sept. 12.--John J. and James J. McNamara will be tried on October 11 before Judge Bordwell on indictments charging them with dynamiting and murder in connection with the blowing up of the Los Angeles building. John J. McNamara must be tried in Los Angeles and not in Indianapolis, from which city it was claimed he had been kidnapped, as the defense has requested. The bill of exception filed by counsel for McNamara questioned the jurisdiction of the Superior Court, but the court held it had jurisdiction. Cyrus McNutt, one of the attorneys for the defense, stated there would be no appeal from his decision.

Sweetened Streets In New Orleans

New Orleans, La., Sept. 12--A flood of molasses swept down several streets leading from a storage warehouse last night, when a tank containing about a million gallons of the Louisiana product burst with a tremendous report. A sticky morass fifteen inches deep covered market street for nearly a mile. Thirty residents secured a year's supply by merely scooping up the syrup with buckets.

The explosion was caused by a wall supporting five similar tanks crumbling beneath the tremendous weight. The flow of the molasses was so swift that two boilers weighing fifteen tons, and near the warehouse were swept from their foundations and carried across the street. The loss was estimated at \$50,000.

101,600 Boys and Girls in Boston Schools

Boston, Sept. 13.--More than 101,000 boys and girls registered Wednesday at the opening of the public schools and although some of the buildings were taxed there was room for every student. The attendance at the high schools has increased remarkably. Four new school buildings were opened. The large list of supplies for the use of the pupils included 150 tons of paper, 150 cases of books, 3,400 gross of pencils, 6,000 quarts of ink, 2,000 gross of pens and 30,000 tons of coal.---Bangor News

Train Wreck

Four are dead and several injured in the wreck of a work train on the new belt line in Cleveland, Ohio. One body was taken from the wreck. Eleven injured have been taken to the hospital and seven more are in the debris. All are foreigners.
