Maritime Press Association

Moncton, N. B., [Oct. 11.--News-
paper men in attendance at the Mar-
itime Press Association put in a busy
time today, and when adjournment
came at 10 o'clock tonight all voiced
the opinion that the meeting had been
an enjoyable and profitable one.

This morning the visitors were taken
to the new I. C. R. shops by special
train, provided by the management.
On returning from the shops the party
was met by autos and taken to the oil
and gas wells in Albert county. Dr.

Henderson, president of the Moncton
Electricity & Gas Company, accom-
panying the party. At the wells the
visitors were shown over the scene of
development work, demonstrations
being given in pumping oil and the
force of gas bottled up in the wells.

The newspaper men were astonished
to learn that there was a flow of
12,000,000 cubic feet of gas per day
from one well alone, while the total
daily flow now developed is 60,000,000
cubic feet, sufficient to light, heat and
furnish power for every residence,
store and factory in the maritime
provinces.

At the company's boarding house the

party were entertained at dinner. On
the way back to Moncton the visitors
were shown through the local govern-
ment demonstration orchard owned by
Lorne Steeves, Lower Coverdale.

3 o'clock and the business sessions
