Will of Joseph Pulitzer Made Public

Many Institutions and Persons Benefit

New York, Nov. 14—The terms of the will of Joseph Pulitzer, which will be filed for probate to-day were made public this morning, its conspicuous features are the ratification of the gift of \$1,000,000 to Columbia University for the establishment of a school of journalism and also ratification of an additional \$1,000,000 for the same purpose, subject to certain conditions, which if not complied with by Columbia before the amount is paid over, will result in the sum going to Harvard University, one half of it for a school of journalism, and one half for many unusual prizes and scholarships, as set forth in the will. Other bequests are \$250,000 for a scholarship fund at Columbia University; \$500,000 to the Metropolitan Museum of Arts; \$500,000 to the Philharmonic Society of New York:

\$100,000 to Mr. Pulitzer's faithful valet, Jabez Dunning, and \$100,000 to be distributed by his executors among his personal secretaries, readers and companions, and certain editorial writers employed on the World; \$50,000 for the erection of a fountain in Central Park; \$25,000 for the erection of a statue to Thomas Jefferson in New York city and some other bequests. The capital stock of his two great newspapers, the New York World and the St. Louis Post-Dispatch are left in trust for his sons, and their male issues during the lives of the two younger sons. Mrs. Pulitzer is given the income from a fund of \$2,500,000, and two daughters are provided for by an income from a fund of \$1,500,000. The income of a million dollars is set aside for the perpetuation of scholarships at Barnard College, which Mr. Pulitzer established some time ago in memory of his daughter Lucille.

Other provisions are: Gold medals costing \$500 for the most disinterested and meritorious service rendered by any American newspaper during the year; \$1,000 for the best history of the services rendered to the public by the American press during the preceding year. Five annual travelling scholarships, \$1,500 each; \$1,000 for the best example of a reporter's work during the year, the test being strict accuracy, terseness, the accomplishment of some public good commanding public attention and respect; \$1,000 for the best American novel published during the year; \$2,000 for the best book of the year upon the history of the United States; \$1,000 for the educational value and power of the state in raising the standard of good moral taste and manners; \$1,000 for the best American biography teaching patriotic and unselfish services to the people.

Striking railroad shopmen at Gila, Ariz., are facing a Southern Pacific order that all water be cut off from their homes and that they be forbidden to get drinking water from water cars, according to telegrams from W. E. Stuart, a union labor officer there, to Tuscon branch of the federation of shopmen. He says the order already has gone into effect, causing a serious problem for the strikers as Gila is on the desert and the only wells there are two owned by the railroad.
