#### Current Events.

The plague has made its appearance in Java.

A severe earthquake shock in Murcia, Spain, on April 3 shattered many buildings, but so far as heard no lives were lost.

Nearly a thousand meeting were held in England on April 1 and 2. Councils representing ten thousand evangelical free churches adopted a resolution in support of the proposed treaty and we coming the idea of American churches observing 'Arbitration Sunday. Copies of this resolution were forwarded to President Taft and Sir Edward Arbitration was the theme of the sermons in most of the churches, and a great peace demonstration was held at the Whitefields Tabernacle, where Lord Coleridge presid ed. Mr Birrell, Chief Secretary for Ireland, was the principal speaker After quoting: 'There is a tide in the affairs of men, he said: 'To-day there is a great tide and peace wave rolling across the Atlantic It ought to be taken at the flood. Referring at length to Chancellor von Bethstag, when he discussed disarmam ent and international arbitration but without departing one iota from the well known standpoint of the German Government, often declar ed on former occasions, he said that though in his opinion it was be low the grandeur of the theme, yet

The sixty second Congress ass embled in special session at Wash ington on April 4, and though call ed specially by President Taft for the purpose of ratifying the recip rocity agreement between the Unit ed States and Canada, the newly elected Speaker, Mr Champ Clark, while outlining a comprehensive programme that included nearly every issue before the country, made no reference to the only sub ject for which Congress had been called. However, to forestall action by the Democrats Representative McCall of Massachusetts introduced the reciprocity bill which was passed by the House at the last session but which failed to pass the Senate.

The work on the Veto bill, designed to restrict the powers over legislation of the House of Lords was begun on April 3 with the opening of the committee stage in the House of Commons. The debate will be long and keen. Already more than 1,000 amendments, occupying seven ty four printed pages, have been prepared WOODSTOCK and are bound to result in heated discuss

ions and protracted sittings. It is the intention of the government to send the measure to the Upper Chamber by the middle of May, but veteran members of Parliament doubt the possibility of this.

Baron d'Estournelles de Constant, rep resentative of France at The Hague Peace Conference, in an address before the San Franciso City Club, referring to conditions in California, said: 'But there is a storm hanging over your heads, a bat tle that threatens destruction of all this loveliness, and it is of this . I have come to warn you. Japan does not want war any more than you do, but may be forced into it by a force of circumstances that seems to be involving you both. Let me tell you that Japan does not want war with you or any other country, and never will there be a war between this country and Japan unless it is stirred up by ignor ance in both nations.'-World Wide.


