Seventeen million dollars will be spent by the Grand Trunk Pacific during 1911 in constructing new lines and erecting station buildings throughout the West. There will be 619 miles of work undertaken on the branch lines and completed during the present season. This will include the Calgary branch, Battleford branch, Melville Regina branch, Alberta coal branch, Regina boundary branch, Moose Jaw branch, Prince Albert branch and Biggar to Calgary. There will also be 265 miles of main line track laid, as well as 200 miles further grading on the branch lines. Arrangements are also being made for the erection of 140 station buildings. This is the largest and most expensive year's work that the Grand Trunk Pacific has undertaken.—St John Globe.

SMALLPOX IN KENT.

Richibucto Review.—The smallpox situation at Sapin is growing serious. Both post offices have been quarantined as well as several houses. It is reported that several residents of the place were in Richibucto on Monday and on their return found their houses quarantined. The secretary of the Board of Health was sent for and put placards on the infected houses. No doctor had been summoned and up to this time the chairman of the Board of Health had not been reached. New cases are reported today from Richibucto Village.

Many letters are received from natives of Carleton County now residing in different parts of the world, requesting a certificate of date and place of birth. Except where infant baptism is the rule and the clergyman attends to registration few births are reported to the registrar, although the law requires that the father or in his absence the mother shall attend to this duty. Consequently many of these requests cannot be complied with, this is often a cause of much inconvenience and sometimes considerable loss on request the registrar will forward a self-addressed envelope containing as many registration forms as required which are easily filled and cost nothing.

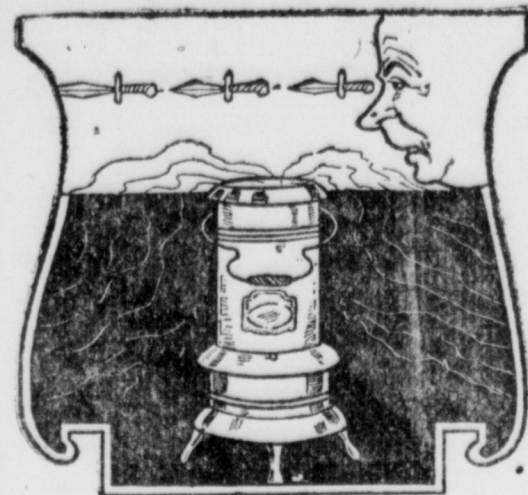
