#### SEVERELY BURNED

In an effort to save as many as possible of his horses and cattle in the fire in his barn on Wednesday of last week, J M Stev ens of Andover, received very severe burns on his arms. As he would release an animal and drive it from the barn the panie-stricken brute would again enter the stable. Even the use of blankets over their heads would not make the horses manageable. In the barn which was burned were two horses, four cattle, one mowing machine, one potato digger, one land roller, two harrows, two single wagons, one sloven wagon, two sets of double harness, two sets of light harness, 200 bushels of oats four tons of fertilizer and a large quantity of hay and potatoes. The loss was estimated at upwards of \$4,000 with in surance amountinfi to \$22000, and distribut ed as follows; \$400 on farm implements \$300 on hay and \$1500 on the barn.
