David C Burpee, J Ray mond Bucpee and Wm D Burpee, to build a bridge across the St John river between Van Buren Maine and St Leonards, N B. and es tablishing the right of the usual tolls, the bridge to be erected within four years, and the capital stock to be \$40,000.


