### ANIMALS ARRIVED.

Two hundred wild animals from Africa consigned to the Ringling Brothers' Circus, arrived at New York Monday on board the Minnetonka, of the Atlantic Transport line. The animals were under the care of Dr Ernest W Tomlin, assisted by three African Boys. The most valuable member of the group is a leopard, captured near the hunting estate of Alfred Jordan, near Nairobi. This leopard has caused the death of five natives. The collection consists of sixteen zebras, two leopards, one baboon, one hyena, two porcupines, one hartebeest, one cheeta, two Isabella gazelles, two Thompson gazelles, four Cerval cats and four Eland antelopes.

### NEW BRIDGE ACROSS THE ST JOHN RIVER.

Augusta, Me., Jan 25—An act was introduced in the Maine Legislature this morning by Representative Ira G Hersey, of Houlton, to incorporate the "St John River Toll Bridge Company," granting a charter to Messrs William H Cunliffe, Frank W Mallett, A G Fenlanson, David J Burpee, J Raymond Burpee and Wm D Burpee, to build a bridge across the St John river between Van Buren Maine and St Leonards, N B. and establishing the right of the usual tolls, the bridge to be erected within four years, and the capital stock to be \$40,000.
