Ottawa, May 26—Saturday June third, the birthday of King George V has been proclaimed a legal holiday throughout the Dominion. No announcement has yet been made regarding Coronation Day June 22nd.

**THE EFFECTS OF SPRAYING.**

From all quarters comes the complaint that the apple trees are covered with worms which are eating leaves and buds and people are asking what they will do to save their trees. These worms are the ordinary tent Caterpillar which is more or less plentiful every year and this seems to be one of the 'more' years.

This pest never appears in a well cared for orchard and the demonstration work done by Provincial Horticulturist Turney at several orchards is bringing this very forcibly to the attention of fruit growers near these orchards.

Mr J W Clark, part of whose orchard at Manguerville is being used for Demonstration work by the Provincial Horticulturist, reports that not a worm is visible in his orchard and that on that part where the strong lime sulphur spray was used before the buds opened that none of the eggs hatched. Other orchardists who have used only the weak lime sulphur and poison spray before the blossoms opened state that all the Caterpillars are dead. Orchards where no spraying has been done are mostly alive with Caterpillars that are working serious damage to the leaves and blossoms, and many enquiries as to what is best to do are coming to the Department of Agriculture.

As it is not wise to give a general spray while the tree is in blossom all that can be done until the blossoms fall is to try and kill or remove the Caterpillars while they are massed on the limbs by hand, or to spray them with paraffine oil in the mass. As soon as the blossoms fall, a spray of Lime Sulphur solution in the proportion of one gallon Lime Sulphur to 40 gallons of water, or Bordeaux Mixture, with either 12 ounces of Paris Green, or 2 lbs Lead Arsenate to each 40 gallons mixture should be given all orchards to kill Caterpillars, help prevent Black Scab and kill the Codling Moth Worm. This spray must be given before the Calyx of the blossom closes up to be effective.

A Bulletin by Provincial Horticulturist, A G Turney, dealing with the care of orchards and giving full directions as to spraying is just off the press and now ready for distribution. It may be had free, on application to the Department of Agriculture, Fredericton.

Many people in this city and all over the province will regret to hear of the death of Mrs Harriet Sophia, widow of Lewis Pickett, of Andover, which occurred suddenly in her home there on Wednesday evening May 17th. She had been in her usual good health up to a week ago, when she contracted a slight cold. Nothing serious was anticipated, however, as the outcome and she was about the house as usual spending the day in reading and writing. Towards evening she passed peacefully away without any warning. She was the mother of H H Pickett of this city, and many here will have very kindly memories of his genial disposition. In the vicinity of her home she will be missed the most. There she was beloved by all as she was ever busy in good works. Her husband died twenty years ago. Her father, the late sheriff Beckwith, was for many years in business with his brother, the late Hon John A Beckwith, in Fredericton. Two sons and two daughters are at home. **THE SUMMER SCHOOL OF SCIENCE**

Already a large enrollment of teachers has been made, and many not in the teaching profession have also joined the Summer School. The School meets on July 12, in Fredericton, and lasts about three weeks.
