

UNITED STATES AND JAPAN.

The United States has received from the President the treaty with Japan which was dawn up some time ago. The main points in the agreement which were agreed to last! fall are as followers;

That Japan will coperate with the United States that Japan may agree to a neutraliza tion of the Manchurian railways in adherence to the American spirit with the provise how over that similar withdrawal be made by all powers now enjoying concessions of the kind from China; the American recogni ion of Japan as the guiding influence in the Far East and her liberty to act inunison with her foreign treaties following the usual notification to this country: Japanese sup port of Chinese integrity opening of ports and cities within Japan's control to the trade specifically affecting Corea, Formosa, Saghalien and Port Arthur; utilization of Jhpan's good offices in future Far Eastern questions continued recognition of Japan's state distentions relative to Southern Man churca and arrangements faci i ating the fin ancing of Japanese enterprises in the Orient

There is one feature that will provoke dis cussion and strong opposition because of the feeling on the Pacific coast. That is the ex clusion of Japanese laborers by law. Japan has been deeply wounded by the action of United States in this matter, and she has promised to so restrict legi-lation that the United States will have no cause of com plaint. The new treaty will contain this un derstanding but the representatives from the Pacific coast states are satisfied with nothing less than exclusion and are expect ed to seek to prevent the adoption of the

IMPORTANT DECISION:

The decision of the Interstate Commerce Commission of furing permission to the ral ways in the : sto n and western parts of the United Stat to acrease their freight rates is one of the mos important events of the day. The re lws/s, holding that their ex peases had ten olorgely increased by ad vauce in emp ey; wages, higher price of materials, etc, warted to so increase their rates that an additional revenue of about \$27,000,000 annually would be secured. The shippers protested vigorously against this course, claiming that the rai way revenue was now large enough for all proper purposes. Louis Brandeis who appeared for the shippers and who is regarded as a ra lway expert made what seemed to be the astounding claim that railways are not wel managed, and that if there were "scientific management" a mi lion dollars a day could be saved. That being the case certainly there would be no reason for burdening the people by increasing the freight rates. Apparently this reasoning had some in fluence with the Commi sion. A feature of the stuggle was the support given the railway managers by the railway labor unions. A though wages have been largely increased in recent years, it is claimed the workman's share of the profits is not yet large enough and further demands have been projected. The railways, if this decree is sustained, fice a serious question. Already, there has been a slump in the stock market. If the railway con tentions were sound, the companies must cut down expenses in some way, if they are to continue the payment of dividends to share holders .-- Sr John Globe

FRANCE


M Briand who on Monday resigned the premiership of France because his soci list radical associates in the Chamber of Deputes declared they had lost confidence in him, had a rapid rise in politics. A revolutionary socialist when he entered the Chamber from the Loire district, he came to the front as a champion of those who favored the separation of church and state and repressive church measures, and naturally became a cabinet mulister when the anti-clerical pel icy won. In July, 1909 he became prmeier. It is the irony of fat that he should be attacked by his fellow socialists on the ground of cler calism, for which there was no basis. Be hind that charge was the fact that M Briand had vigorously assailed the laber unions of government employes and that he was prepar ing l-gislation to prevent a recurrence of last year's strike troubles. This it was that aggravated his former associates (some of whom were intensely jealous of his advance ment) and finely led to their arraigment o him in the chamber. M Briand's successor is not yet known but it locks as if he will have stormy time. The socialist-radical element grows stronger and more aggressive yearly. -St John Globe
