Current Events.

The glass coach belonging to the King and the barouche owned by the Queen, both of which were to have been used during the coronation procession next June, were destroyed by a fire in the shop of the coach builders on Feb 16. The coach was very valuable. It was the so-called Acorn coach and was 200 years old. It was made of English ash and weighed three tons. It was at the carriage shop for the purpose of being revarnished.

Much excitement has been caused in Lisbon by the dismissal from the service of Capt Fonseca of the Tenth Regiment of Infantry, stationed at Braganza. He is charged with inciting the soldiers to revolt in favor of the restoration of the monarchy.

Trouble has started again with the tribesmen in Morocco. The truce entered upon by the Spaniards and the heads of thirteen different tribes was broken a few days ago, when a combat occurred in which it is known many on both sides were killed.

Dr Grenfell, the medical missionary of the Labrador coast, has been selected as the William Belden Noble lecturer at Harvard University for 1911-12.

In reply to a question in the British House of Commons the Under Secretary for the Foreign Office said that the British Ambassador at St Petersburg has been instructed to protest against Russia's proposed extension of her fishery limits. Germany, Japan, Denmark, Norway and Sweden have already made representations on this subject to the Russian Foreign Office. The cause of the complaint is Russia's action in introducing in the Duma a bill extending her territorial limit from three to twelve miles seaward from the Archangel coast and the coast of the White Sea.

The country surrounding Amoy, China, is at present overrun with bands of armed robbers, and the bold have ventured into the heart of the city, terrorizing the inhabitants. The authorities have adopted strong measures to suppress the outlawry, and four robbers were beheaded on Feb 10. The bands come generally from the direction of Hunan province where the famine has made thousands of men desperate.

A convention has been signed by Great Britain and Austria-Hungary providing that differences of a legal nature or relating to existing treaties that cannot be settled by diplomacy must be referred to the arbitration court at The Hague when they do

not affect the vital interests, in dependence or honor of the two countries and do not concern the interests of other powers.

Henry Tompson, who was one of John Browns lieutenants at Harpers Ferry, died last week in Pasadena, Cal., aged eighty-nine. After the surrender of Lee, Thompson married Browns daughter. She died five years ago.

After drastic measures the rebellion in Hayti has been quelled. Following the judgement of a court-martial six rebel generals, including Gen Milliard, the head of the revolution, were taken from the jail at Trou in the night and shot.

Lord Fisher of Kilverstone and Lord Charles Beresford, having reached the age limit for active service in the navy went upon the retired list last week.

The Emperor William has been laid up with a severe cold for a week necessitating the cancellation of all official entertainments. It is reported that the Empress is also ill.

Count Albert Apponyi, formerly Speaker of the Hungarian Diet, who is in the United States to preach peace among the nations of the world was honored on Feb 10 by the reception by the whole body of the House of Representatives at Washington, when from the Speaker's dais he spoke eloquently closing his remarks:— We of the Old World desiring to come out the devouring waste of the ancient spirit of animosity and distrust appeal to you and if perhaps not yet you feel the shore but the sand under your feet we appeal to you for resistance to do away with the hateful legacy of hatred and war and antagonism between men who ought to be brethren. This is the object of my mission in America. This is what I think the spirit of the Old World has to say to the spirit of the world.

In the first division of the new British Parliament the House of Commons by a majority of 102 reaffirmed adherence to free trade principles. The division was taken on the Opposition's amendment to the address in reply to the speech from the throne, urging fiscal reform with special references to the proposal reciprocity agreement between Canada and the United States which was moved by Mr Austen Chamberlain. The amendment was rejected by a vote of 324 to 222. The Nationalists, who heretofore have abstained from voting in fiscal divisions on this occasion supported the government as did also the Laborites.

The gravity of the situation resulting from the famine and plague in China has seriously alarmed the government, and the authorities are now seeking advice from foreigners as they have never done before. The nation is beginning to learn its lesson and effective measures are being promulgated. Troops have been moved to several places and stricken villages are being cordoned.—World Wide.

WASPS AGAINST FLIES

In the war against noxious insects the employment of insect allies is a measure that is coming rapidly into vogue. Among these allies one of the most important is the wasp bembex, because it has been found to be an inveterate enemy of glossina flies which are the conveyors of infection for the incurable sleeping sickness of Africa. It has been called The Glossina Hunter of Dahomey, and according to the observations of Doctor Bouffard at Bamaku it is the only hymenopterous insect which attacks these flies. The bembex performs its work in true knight errant fashion, flying around animals that are persecuted by the flies darting upon them with a speed that almost defies the eye and transfixing them with its sting, after which it carries the victims off to its nest as food for larvae.

HAYTI'S TREE OF LIBERTY
