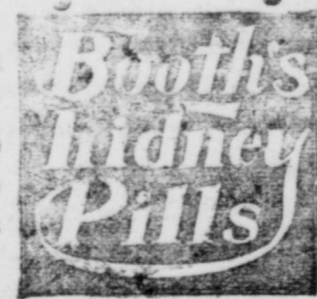

LINOLEUMS FOR BEDROOM.

If you have to make any changes
in the covering for your bedroom
floors in your summer cottage this
spring, be sure and get linoleum, as
it is not only the most sanitary floor
covering but is also the most easily
kept clean. There are very pretty
matting designs for bedrooms, and is
hard to detect from the real matting.
It comes two yards wide and is usual-
ly \$1 a running yard, which makes
it much cheaper than carpet, and it
wears several times as long. When
laying it loosen the quarter-round
moulding on the baseboard so the
linoleum will slip under. Do not tack
or nail and let lay at least a week be-
fore nailing down the quarter round
so it can flatten out and get shaped
to floor. About once in a year and a
half or two years go over it with a
floor varnish. This keeps the pat-
terns from wearing off and preserves
the life of the linoleum. It is easily
kept clean and sanitary and does not
have to be taken up until worn out.

**INTERESTING DISCOVERY IN SPITZ-
BERGEN**

(The Scientific American.)

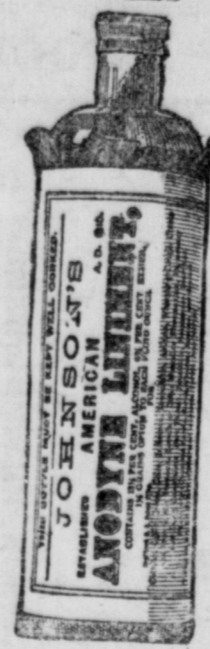
A very interesting discovery was made in
Spitzbergen last summer by the Isachs ex-
pedition. In a cove of Wood's Bay, in the
northern part of the island, hot springs were
found which, in connection with other vo-
canoes existed in this region in
comparatively recent geological times. The
springs, eight in number, are distributed
along one straight fissure and have well de-
veloped geyser terraces. The cone of the vol-
cano itself is very regularly formed, and re-
sembles the craters of Vesuvius and Aetna.
The volcanic minerals found in the vicinity
are of the plug type and consist partly of
olivine. The situation and appearance of the
volcano prove that it is more recent than
the glacial epoch, and must have been in
eruption in the Quaternary period. A piece
of pumice stone of peculiar appearance,
which was found on the shore near Smeren-
berg by the Zepplin expedition this year,
and which was supposed to have drifted
from Iceland, probably came from this vol-
cano, which is not far distant.

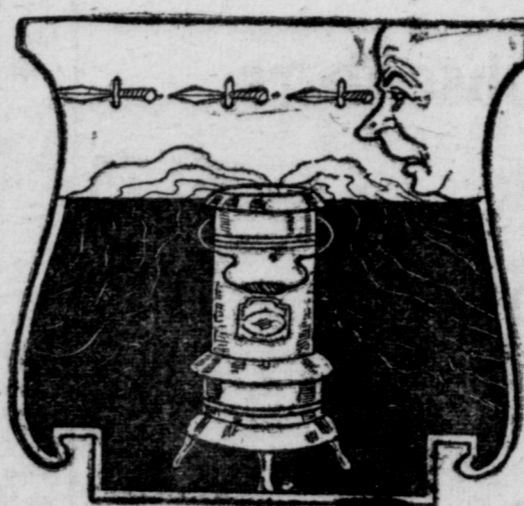
