HOW FARMERS COULD GET PROFIT ON WOOL BY CAREFUL GRADING (Canadian Textile Journal)

Wool Is the farmers product and there is more profit might be obtained by the far mer from his wool if he would be more care ful in the manner in which he sends it to market.

Proper classifying, condition and cleanli ness are factors which save anunying work to the buyers, and, when properly looked after in the first instance, bring not only readier saleability, but a premium in price. Even in Au tralia where the growers may te sup posed to be past masters in all the arts per taining to placing their wool on the market, complaints are made as to careleseness in grading and conditioning. A writer in the Sydney, N S W Stock and Station Journal, gives some instances in illustration of these points. Apart from the fact that it is neces sary to separate entirely from each other the different types or styles of wool that are used in each branch of the manufa turing indus try, the greatest factor in the price per pound pad for wool, is condition. By con dition is meant the yolk or grease which all wool contains in a greater or less degree, to gether with more or less sand or earth. One of the greatest faults in present day classing is neglect or ignorance of the all important point, which will pay handsomely in results for any time and at ention devoted to master

Suppose a particular lot of wool catches the buyer's at ention, and, as he believes it will just fill his requirements, he is prapared to give even an extra cent per pound. On turther examination however, and probing deeper into the bales, he finds a fl-ece which, though it may be good in quality and staple is lacking in condition, compared with those he first saw. TURKE'Y RULER BADLY SCARED

The Sul an arose in alarm and fell back faint lug. The commander of the escort spurced his horse and cut off the approach of the advanc ing Kurd. The horse fell and the confusion was increased. The kurds were all arrested.

ST PETERSBURG, May 20-The Duma has authorized the expenditure of \$150,000, 000 for the re organization of the fleet. The programme includes four Dreadnoughts and six submarines for the Black Sea and four Dreadnoughts for the Baltic, in addition to four battleships which will be launched in July. A small island at the mouth of the River Neva is to be transferred to the admir al y for a new dock yard.

LONDON, May 20.—The members of the Cromer to resign the vice presidency of the organization because he upholds vivi section. 
