### Current Events.

Spain is becoming alarmed over the immigration of her people. It is estimated that nearly two hundred thousand persons leave this country annually for new homes in North and South America. It is proposed to begin large public works in order to give employment to those who might otherwise seek work in foreign places. The plans include irrigation, the construction of twenty thousand miles of highways and branch railroads and the colonization of sections of Aragon and Catalonia now neglected because inadequately watered.

The Jamaica Chamber of Commerce is considering a proposal to recommend to the government the holding of a big exhibition in Kingston in 1915, coincident with the formal opening of the Panama Canal.

The Duke of Connaught, it is officially announced, will succeed Earl Grey as Governor-General of Canada in September next, his term of office to be for two years or longer if so decided.

Mount Etna has become active following a slight earthquake.

With a view to restoring London's lost importance as a shipping port the recently constituted 'Port of London authority' is considering a vast scheme for improvements in the River Thames. Docking facilities involving an expenditure of nearly \$75,000,000 are contemplated, the work to occupy twenty years. The plan includes the dredging of the river mouth to 1,000 feet wide and over 30 feet in depth at Tilbury in the stretch used by the big liners, narrowing gradually to 450 feet wide and 14 feet in depth at London Bridge, the construction of a riverside pontoon at Tilbury for embarking and disembarking passengers building dry docks to accommodate the largest vessels, and improving railway facilities.

The Portuguese minister of foreign affairs announced on Saturday that the Government's decree separating Church and State would be promulgated within a month. Nevertheless he added that the Government had expressed regret to the Vatican that the Pope had no representative in Portugal, where the faithful are so numerous.

### BISMARCK'S NEW YEAR EVE.

He was not averse to punch and grog, but on New Years eve grog was under the ban, for it contains water.

It was officially announced in Berlin on Tuesday that in view of the plague epidemic in the Far East, the tour of Crown Prince Frederick William will be terminated at Calcutta, from which city he will return home. German representatives have been instructed to express the regrets of the government and the Crown Prince at Bangkok, Peking and Tokio, and also to the United States and the Netherlands to whose colonies a visit had been planned. The wording of the official statement indicates that the visit to China and Japan, to which political importance is attached, possibly may be undertaken at a later date.

Mrs Elizabeth Phelps Ward, the eminent American author, died at her home in Newton Centre, Mass., on Saturday in her 67th year.

After being dormant for many years the volcano, Taal, in Batangas province, Philippine Islands, is again active. The eruptions began at two o'clock on Saturday morning and were accompanied by three heavy earthquakes and followed by ninety lesser shocks. More than 300 persons were killed, hundreds more injured and a half dozen villages destroyed by a tidal wave and other elemental visitations that followed the eruption of the volcano. The rain of mud and stones has fallen on villages within a radius of twenty miles, and the natives are fleeing from their homes in Manila, which is only thirty four miles from the volcano, there is great uneasiness, particularly among the native population, many of whom are preparing to leave.

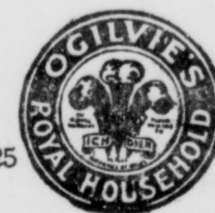
