Tacoma, Wash, Mar 25-The women of Tacoma in their first test at the polls in the city's bistory, came out strongly against the saloon element, according to this week's re turns from the referendum election It was the first referendum vote under the new city charter.

By a substantial majority the women secu red the adoption of an anti treating ordin ance making it illegal for saloon keepers to accept money from any person treating an other.


This result shows that women hold the bal ance of power in Tacoma. Of 21,587 voters who registered for the election 65 per cent voted and of these approximately 5000 were women. Ninety per cent of the women vot ed for the anti treating ordinence.

The courses in Physical Training are open to teachers of both sexes, and consist approx. imately of thirty lessons of one hour each, usually spread over three weeks. At the conclusion of the course, a certificate is grant ed by the Militia Department. The Chief Superintendent of Education announces that in order to obtain a teacher's license in this Province, it is now necessary to have this certificate. Also that after the end of the present year, all teachers must possess it to obtain advance of class, and further, that at the end of four years from the same date, ail schools must provide Physical Training by qualified instructors.

The Summer School of Science affords an excellent opportunity for teachers to obtain this certificate, and at the same time to qualify for better positions in their profee sion by improving themselves in other sub jects by means of the classes in Science. Nature Study, Drawing Laterature, Hand work, etc., from July 13 to August 2, in Fredericton.

Appl cation for admission to the course in Military Drill must be made to the Chief Superistendent of Elucation, and for the Summer School of Science to the Local Sec retary, Fredericton.

The president has been assured by the temporary board that it will be ready with a detailed and comprehensive report on the textile schedules by Dec. I next, and that the chem ical schedules may also be ready.




