Denjiro Kotoku, and his wife. Kotoku was a newspaper man who because fof his radical wrisings, was obliged to leave Japan some years ago. He went to San Francisco, where he conducted a socialist publication for a time. Later he re turned to Tokio, and is credited with hav ing originated the plct which led to the ex ecution of twelve of the twenty six conspira tors. Twenty-four were condemned to death but the sentences of half were commuted to

life imprisonment.

BOSTON BROWN BREAD

'Mix and sift one cupful each of rye meal, granulated corn meal and Graham flour,' says Fannie Merritt Farmer in Woman" Home Companion for February. "Add one teaspoonfull salt, three fourths of a teaspoon ful of soda, three fourths of a cupful of molas ses and one and three fourths cupfuls of sweet milk. Stir until well mixed, turn into a bu tered mold, cover and steam three and one half hours. Do not fill the mold more than two thirds full. The cover should be tied down firmly with a string: otherwise the bread in rising might force off cover. If a steamer is not at hand, place mold on a tri vet in kettle containing bolling water, allow ing water to come half way around mold. Cover closely and steam, adding as needed more boiling water."


