## CURRENT EVENTS

King George has announced his intention to entertain a hundred thousand London children at the Crystal Palace on June 30 in celebration of his coronation.

The Portuguese Government has decided to dismiss the Bishop of Oporto for having urged the priests of his diocese to read a forbidden pastoral letter, also for encouraging the people to revolt. Several priests have been arrested for reading the letter to their congregations.

By the explosion of a moving picture machine in a small theatre in Bologoe, Southern Novgorod, Russia, on Monday, causing a panic and fire, over a hundred persons lost their lives, many of them being children.

The expulsion of Jews from various parts of Russia is being pursued with great ferocity, those from Tchernigov alone numbering 2,000. Many families in Cheliabinsk have been listed for expulsion, the majority of the men being grain merchants. They have appealed to the Minister of the Interior to consider their case.

M. Monis has succeeded in forming a Cabinet but the prediction is made that it will be short lived. It is a ministry of the Left composed chiefly of Radicals, and Radicals, Socialists, and the Republican majority remains. Premier Monis has no particular mandate, and under these circumstances a barren career for his ministry is looked for while it lasts. Apart from M. Jaures's organ, the "Humanite," which is completely content, the Ministry has met with a hostile reception from the Paris press. It is considered a Combes Ministry without Combes. However the ministry has been cheered by receiving a large vote of confidence on the Premier reading the ministerial declaration, which was conservative in tone.

The will of the late Lord Swaythling the London banker has been sworn for probate at £1,500,000 or \$7,500,000. All bequests to the testator's children or those inheriting through the children are subject to a clause providing that at his death they must be professing the Jewish religion and must not be married to persons not professing it. It lays a solemn injunction on the children against abandoning the Jewish religion or intermarrying outside of it at any time or under any circumstances. The trustees are empowered to withhold three fourths of their inheritance from two daughters who have assisted the Liberal Judaism movement if after his death they assist it directly or indirectly.

The United States Senate has by a vote of 46 to 40 decided not to declare illegal the election of Senator Lorimer, of Illinois, who was charged with having obtained his seat by bribery and corruption, and whose case has caused much acrimonious discussion both in Congress and the Press.

The notorious outlaw Hakim Khan, who has been for years a thorn in the side of the British northwest frontier Indian forces, was surprised the other day with thirty of his followers in a cave by a force under the command of Lieut. Col. Sir George Roos Keppel chief commissioner and agent to the governor general of the northwest frontier province. Hakim refused to surrender and a machine gun battle led into his den until all but five of the party were killed.

President Taft has issued a proclamation fixing April 4th for the convening of the sixty second Congress in extraordinary session to enact legislation regarding the tariff agreement made between the United States Department of State and the Canadian Government, a bill endorsing which had passed the House of Representatives but had failed to reach a vote in the Senate.

The Manitoba Grain Growers' Association adopted a resolution repudiating statements in the Hon. Clifford Sifton's speech in the House of Commons at Ottawa that the grain growers oppose reciprocity. They further declared for the ratification of the reciprocity agreement; complete abolition of all duties on agricultural machinery, and the increase of the British preference to 50 percent on the general tariff.

The United States Congress which will assemble on April 4th will be greatly changed compared with the last. The Senate just expired numbered 48 Regular Republicans, 11 Insurgent Republicans, and 32 Democrats. The new Senate, so far as can be judged, with a few elections still undecided, will have 41 Democrats, 38 Regular Republicans and 13 Insurgents. The House of Representatives will have a Democratic majority of about 50, who by the utterances of Representatives Clark and Underwood are already committed to support the reciprocity bill. They have notified the President, however, that their tariff labors will not end there: they will bring in one or two other tariff bills as well. These will doubtless include a big cut in the woollen and perhaps the cotton schedules. When these measures reach the Senate they are more certain of a sympathetic reception than was reciprocity recently. The Insurgents will welcome a cut in woollens, as this schedule has been one vital reason for their being Insurgents. Their proclaimed reason for opposing reciprocity is that it did not go far enough. The chances are they will be relieved of that objection next session.

Owing to unsettled conditions in Mexico, a great concentration of United States troops has been ordered at San Antonio and Galveston, Tex., and in the vicinity of Los Angeles, Cal. The navy will take part in this unusual movement, and the fifth division of the Atlantic fleet will proceed to the vicinity of Galveston, in the Gulf of Mexico. Seven hundred marines have been ordered from Philadelphia to Guantanamo, Cuba, whence they presumably will be distributed among the ships ordered to Galveston. It is the first intimation from the Washington Administration that affairs in Mexico are not as well in hand as recent reports would tend to show. —World Wide.

## DIAMONDS DISCOVERED IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Ottawa, March 16—The director of the geological survey announced that diamonds have been discovered by the survey in a British Columbia rock, the first recorded discovery of diamonds in Canada. The rock carrying the crystals is a peridotite of the variety known as dunite, consisting of olivine and chromite. The rock specimens in which the diamonds were found were collected by Mr Charles Cammell, on Olivine Mountain, where Mr Cammell has been making geological examination on behalf of the survey. Samples of the rock were submitted to Mr R A Johnston, mineralogist of the survey, to ascertain the nature of the chromite minerals. In the course of his examination Mr Johnston secured some insoluble fragments of crystals which appeared to be diamonds. More of this material was separated out and a series of tests conducted by Mr Johnston establishes beyond doubt the nature of the material. The individual diamonds so far extracted from a number of samples, are small, none of them being larger than an ordinary pinhead, but many appear under the microscope to be clear and bright and of good quality, though some are yellowish or brownish.

## LOG DRIVING ON THE ST JOHN RIVER

Fredericton, N B March 11—With the approach of Spring the St John River Log Driving Company are making their usual preparations for handling the logs coming down the St John river this season. On account of the large number of logs held in the main river above the corporation limit since last season a number of piers has been erected at Ouilette bar, about 15 miles from the mouth of the Allagash in the hope of holding the logs so that they will not come out with the ice. Within a day or two the annual meeting of the St John River Log Driving Co will be formally called and tenders for the log driving contract on the lower corporation from Grand Falls to the boom limits will be asked for. Mr John St Scott's contract for the driving has been completed and he will, it is stated not tender again. A prominent lumberman said this morning that he had heard there would be a number of tenderers for the contract.

The Babbitt estate mill at St Marys commenced sawing this week and will manufacture about three million feet this season. The York and Sunbury Milling Company mill at G 1

will commence sawing about the first of April and will manufacture between four and five million feet this year. It is believed that the operations on the upper St John river which will probably be the last concluded will be all finished by about the 25th inst. Already some arrangements are being made for the stream driving operations this spring.—St John Globe.
