#### CURRENT EVENTS

King George has announced his intention to entertsia a hundred thousand London chil dren at the Crystal Palace on June 30 in cele bration of his coronation.

The Portuguese Government has decided to dismiss the Bishop of Oporto for having urged the priests of his diocese to read a forbidden pasteral letter, also for encouraging the people to revolt. Several priests have been arrested for reading the let er to their congregations.

By the explosion of a moving picture ma chine in a small theatre in Bologoe, Southern Novgorod, Russia, on Monday, causing a panic and fire, over a hundred persons lost their lives, many of them being children.

President Taft has issued a proclamation fixing Ayril 4th for the convening of the six'y

second Congress in extraordinary session to enact legislation regarding the tariff agree ment made between the United States De partment of State and the Canadian Govern ment, a bill endorsing which had passed the House of Representatives but had failed to reach a vote in the Senate.

The Manitoba Grain Growers' Association, adopted a resolution repudiating statements in the Honf Clifford Sifton's speech in the House of Commons at Ottawa that the grain growers oppose reciprocity. They further de clared forgthe rat fication of the reciprocity agreement; complete abolition of all duties on agricultural machinery, and the increase of the British preference to 50 percent ou the general tariff.

The United States Congress which will as semble on April 4th will be greatly changed compared withithe last. The Senate just ex pired numbered 48 Regular Republicans, 11 Insurgent Republicans, and 32 Democrats. The new Senate, so far as can be judged, with a few elections still undecided, will have 41 Democrate, 38 Regular Republicans and 13 Insurgents. The House of Representatives will have a Democra ic majority of about 50, who by the utterances of Representatives Olark and Uuderwood are already committed to support the (reciprocity bill. They have notified the President, however, that their tariff labors will not end there: they will bring injone or two other tariff bills as well. These will doubtless include a big cut in the woollen and perhaps; the cotton schedules. When these measures reach the Senate they are more certain of a sympathetic reception than was reciprocity recently. The Insurg ents. will welcome a cut in woollens, as this schedule has been one vital reason for their being Insurgents. Their proclaimed reason for opposing reciprocity is that it d.d i.i t go far enough. The chances are they will be re lieved of that objection as xt session.

Owing to unsettled condi ions in Mex co, a great concentration of United States troops has been ordered at San Antonio and Galves ton, Tex., and in the vicinity of Los Angeles, Cal. The navy will take part in this unusual i movement, and the fifth division of the Atlantic fleet will proceed to the vicinity of Galveston, in the Gulf of Mex co. Seven hun dred marines have been ordered from Philad elphia to Guantanamo, Cuba, whence they presumably will be distributed among the ships ordered to Galveston. It is the first in timation from the Washington Administra ion that affairs in Mexico are not as well in hand as recent reports would tend to show. -World Wide.



#### DIAMONDS DISCOVERED IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Ottawa, March 16-The director of the geological survey announced that dia monds have been discovered by the sur vey in a British Columbia rock, the first recorded discovery of diamonds in Canada The rock carrying the crystals is a perido tite of the variety known as dunite, con sisting of elevine and chromite The rock specimens in which the diamonds were found were collected by Mr Charles Cam sell, on Olivene Mountain, where Mr Cam sell has been making geological examina tion on behalf of the survey. Samples of the rock were submitted to Mr R A Johnston, mineralogist of the survey, to ascertain the nature of the chromiam minerals In the course of his examina tion Mr Johnston secured some insoluble fragments of crystals which appeared to be diamonds More of this material was separated out and a series of tests con ducted by Mr Johnston establishes be yond doubt the nature of the material The individual diamonds so far extracted from a number of samples, are small, none of them being larger than an ordinary hand and foot drive. pinhead, but many appear under the microscope to be clear and bright and of good quality, through some are yellowish or brownish.

The expulsion of Jews from various parts of Russia is being pursued with great feroc ity, those from Tchernigov alone numbering 2,000. Many families in Cheliabrinsk have been listed for explusion, the majority of the men being grain merchants. They have appealed to the Minister of the Interior to consider their case.

M Monis has succeeded in forming a Cab, inet but the prediction is made that it will be short lived. It is a ministry of the Left composed chiefly of Radicals, and Radical Socialists, and the Republican majority remains. Premier Monis has no particular man date, and under these circumstances a bar ren career for his ministry is looked for while it laste. Apart from M Jaures's organ, the "Humanice,' which is completely content, the Ministry has met with a hostile reception from the Paris press. It is considered a Comes Ministry without Combes. However the ministry has been cheered by receiving a large vote of confidence on the Premier reading the ministerial declaration, which was conservative in tone.

London backer has been sworn for probate at £ 1,500,000 or \$7,500,000. All bequests to the testat r's children or those inheriting through the children are subject to a clause providing that at his death they must be pr. essing the Jewish religion and must not be married to persons not professing it. It lays a solemu injunction on the children against mandoning the Jewish religion or intermatry ing outside of it at any time or under any cir cumstances. The trustees are empowered to withhold three fourths of their inheritance from two daughters who have assisted the Liberal Judaian movement if after his death they assist it directly or indirectly.

The United States Sena e has by a vote of A6 to 40 decided not to declare illegal the election of Senator Lorimer, of Illineis, who was charged with having obtained his seat by bribery and corruption, and whose case has caused much acrimonious discussion both in Congress and the Press.

The actorious outlaw Hakim Khan, who has been for years a thora in the side of the British northwest frontier Indian forces, was surprised the other day with thirty of his fol lowers in a cave by a force under the com mand of Lient. 

Fredericton, N B March 11-With the approach of Spring the St John River Log Driving Company are mak ing their usual preparations for handl ing the logs coming down the St John river this season. On account of the large numbr of logs held in the main river above the corporation lim its since last season a number of piers has been erected at Ouillette bar, about 15 miles from the mouth of the Allagash in the hope of holding the logs so that they will not come out with the ice. Within a day or two the annual meeting of the St John River Log Driving Co will be form ally called and tenders for the log driving contract on the lower corpora tion from Grand Falls to the boom limits will be asked for. Mr John St Scott's contract for the driving has been completed and he will, it is stat ed not tender again. A prominent lumberman said this morning that he had heard there would be a number of tenderers for the contsact.
