### IODINE IN SURGERY

For several decades carbolic acid and bichloride of mercury have been the chief antiseptics used by surgeons, but they are being discarded for iodine, which, it is said, is safer and more effective.

Dr J L Wollheim has contributed an article on "Iodine in Surgery" to the American Journal of Surgery, of which the following conclusions appear in American Medicine:

1. From 0.2 per cent, to 1 per cent, iodine is an antiseptic of marked potency.
2. It is far superior to bichloride of mercury. Two per cent solution killed step *Coccus pyogenes* in two minutes.
3. (a) It is easily prepared and is stable.  
(b) It is one-fourth as toxic as bichloride of mercury.  
(c) It does not coagulate albumen.  
(d) It is effective in very brief time.  
(e) The stain soon disappears (easily removed by aqua ammonii).  
(f) It is very penetrating.
4. One-half of 1 per cent is strong enough for all purposes as an antiseptic.

Nicholas Senn was a strong advocate of iodine in surgery. In his valuable article his conclusions are:

1. Iodine is the safest and most potent of all known antiseptics.
2. Iodine in proper dilution to serve its purposes as an antiseptic does not damage the tissues; on the contrary, it acts the part of a useful tissue stimulant, producing an active phagocytosis, a process so desirable in the treatment of acute and chronic inflammatory affections.

### WASHING A SILK DRESS.

A black and white checked silk dress, which was very much soiled, was to be made over. It was ripped up, but nothing more could be done until some way was found to clean it. Water spotted it and it was a problem how to clean it. We had nearly given it up when our laundress came to the rescue and advised the following:

Dissolve one-half cake of good white soap in hot water; when thoroughly dissolved and cool add one-half cupful of molasses and one half cupful of spirits of turpentine. Add this to enough warm water to wash the dress in; wash thoroughly, using more soap if needed; rinse in three or four waters; dry and press on the wrong side.

The dress came out as bright and clean as new, and when it is soiled again will be washed in the same way without ripping, as it can be pressed nicely as it is. Ribbons can be cleaned in this way, too, and look much better than when washed in the ordinary way. Articles cleaned must be aired for a day or so before wearing, as turpentine leaves an odor.

### GALE RAGING OVER THE BRITISH ISLES.

London, Jan 12.—A gale of hurricane force, accompanied at many points by a heavy snowfall, broke over the British Isles early today. Much damage was done both on land and at sea. Huge seas were running on the coast, and many minor wrecks but few casualties were reported.

The boys were filled with shipping which had sought shelter from the storm, and exciting scenes were witnessed, as many of the small craft dragged their anchors and were driven ashore. The life saving crews were busy taking imperilled sailors from their boats. Seaside towns were invaded by the high waters and suffered considerably. Telegraph lines were blown down at many points.

### THE BANANA IN MEDICINE.

Recent experiments indicate that the juice of the banana may be efficacious in the treatment of diphtheria and other maladies of the throat. A substance resembling pepsin and called bromelin, has been isolated from banana juice, and has been shown to possess the property of dissolving albuminous matter, such as forms the obstructing membrane characteristic of diphtheria. Doctor Flaescher employs a syrup made from banana in cases of bronchial affection. A crystalline substance called mannitol is obtained from the banana, and is employed in the composition of various remedies for throat and lung troubles.

To clean a sponge soak it in milk several hours, then wring dry and rinse thoroughly in warm water to which has been added a teaspoonful of carbonic acid.

### ENGLAND EXCITED.

It is understood that the United States will accept the proposal of Sir Edward Grey, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, for a settlement by direct negotiation of questions as to the reasonableness of certain specific regulations referred by the award of The Hague Tribunal in the Newfoundland fisheries dispute to a commission of experts. The negotiations will be conducted by a conference of representatives of the United States, Canada, Newfoundland and the British Charge d'Affaires at Washington.

The Spanish cabinet has been reconstructed during the week, three new ministers replacing members who were not in accord with Premier Canalejas's policy. On New Year's day the Premier laid before the King his programme for reforms, including education and labor unions, obligatory military service and the solving of the problem of the Government of the Canary Islands. The King approved the programme throughout.

Violent earthquakes in Russian Turkestan are reported, causing great destruction of life and property.

All England is intensely excited over the murders of policemen by Russian anarchists and burglars in Houndsditch, East London, which culminated on Tuesday in one of the most tragic events ever recorded in the history of the British metropolis. The police had traced the terrorists to their den in Sydney street, and were watching the premises when a detective sergeant was fired upon and dangerously wounded. The house had in the morning been surrounded by a cordon of police, while several detachments of armed police, a battery of horse artillery with three machine guns and a Gatling gun and a fire brigade, were present to help. Whenever the officers approached the house a volley of bullets bespattered the pavement. A detachment of sixty men with one officer and three non-commissioned officers of the Scots' Guard from the Tower, arrived later and were served with ball cartridges. They fired a few rounds into the building. There was a lull for five minutes and then the besieged replied. It was impossible to estimate the number of the besieged, as they were armed with magazine rifles and fired with great rapidity. The soldiers meanwhile kept up a fusillade directed at the windows and the men within responded continuously. Meantime loads of straw were hurried to the place for the purpose of starting a fire and smoking out the besieged men. Piles of straw were ignited near the building, and the flames soon communicated to the house. The fire brigade divided their energies between putting out the fire and in trying to flood out the outlaws. Streams of water were thrown through the windows, but in the face of terrific odds, the trapped men continued a desperate resistance, and every few minutes appeared at the windows and emptied their guns at any one in sight. The flames meantime, swept through the building, driving the occupants to the top story. Hard pressed the terrorists kept up the grim fight. At two o'clock the whole building was in flames, and the desperadoes had been driven from within to the roof, whence they fired indiscriminately upon the police and the soldiers below. As fire enveloped the house heavy explosions occurred. These apparently were of ammunition with which the men seemed to have been well supplied. Up to the time that the roof gave way the firemen had made

a serious attempt to stay the flames, but when it was seen that cremation only awaited the occupants of the house a police inspector crept through the narrow street and forced the front door. There was no sign from within. The last shot of the defenders had been fired. Firemen brought up a hose and presently were able to enter the ground floor. The place was flooded and a search for its occupants begun. It is said that six bodies have been discovered. Several firemen were injured in the collapse of the building. This extraordinary fight from first to last occupied seven hours. Throughout the fight the greatest excitement prevailed, not only in the neighborhood but in the city, and it required 1,500 policemen massed about the scene to keep back the tens of thousands of spectators who crowded about the firing zone.—World Wide.

### SASKATCHEWAN IN BLIZZARD'S GRIP.

Saskatoon, Sask., Jan 9.—The worst storm since the memorable winter of 1907 swept this district yesterday, and today, and has resulted in much delay in the train service. Many tales of hardship and innumerable cases of frost bites. Telephone and telegraph wires also are badly demoralized. More snow has fallen this year so far than in any previous winter for four years. All trains are delayed.

Regina, Sask., Jan 9.—With fierce marrow scorching north wind whistling and snow falling heavily. Regina for the tenth time in as many days is in the grip of a real blizzard. The mercury is ranging from 10 to 20 below zero and the wind makes it seem forty. Trains are running from one to three hours late and the service is steadily becoming worse as the storm grows in severity. Yesterday was clear and trains were running on time. The streets are drifted many feet deep and the country districts report the worst of a series of terrible storms.

Take some soft twine and twist tightly around under the head of the screw in the center of the wheel, until you have enough on to make it run firmly.
