I ask the students of human life, and Hegel, speaking for Philosophy, replies: "God governs the world; the actual working of his government--the carrying out of his plan--is the History of the World."

I ask the men who are probing for the secret of all life's phenomena, and Ernest Haeckel speaking for Biology, replies: "The more developed man of the present day is capable of, and justified in, conceiving that infinitely nobler and sublimer idea of God which alone is compatible with monistic conception of the universe, and which recognizes God's spirit and power in all phenomena without exception."

I ask the moral reformers, the men who are trying to improve the conditions of their fellow-passengers in this voyage of life, and Mazzini replies: "God exists. We ought not, do not want to prove it; to attempt that would seem blasphemy; to deny it, madness." And again: "Call it God, or what you like, there is life which we have not created, but which is given."

I ask the literary critics who study the lives of men in the record of their thoughts and feelings, and Matthew Arnold replies: "There is a Power not ourselves which makes for righteousness."

I ask the poets, and Alfred Tennyson replies:

"The sun, the moon, the stars, the seas, the hills, and the plains—

Are not these, O Soul, the Vision of Him who reigns? Is not the Vision He? though He be not that which He seems."

I agree with Spencer that the Eternal Energy is ever present in all our lives; with Hegel that He governs the world; with Haeckel that His spirit and power are in all phenomena; with Mazzini that His life is given to the world; with Matthew Arnold that it is a life which makes for righteousness; and with Alfred Tennyson that we may trust the Vision, though He be infinitely more and better than any Vision we have of him.

Proposed Pulp Mill

Fredericton Gleaner: There is a strong possibility of a ground wood pulp mill being erected at Pokiok Falls in the near future. In 1908 the Gilman Brothers and Burden property on the Pokiok was purchased by Dr. Al. C. and Rufus E. Haggarty, of E. L. Smith and Sedgewick, Miramichi, at a cost of \$45,000 and they have already taken off the property enough lumber to repay their investment, as well as having 100,000 cords of pulp and large quantities of lumber left on the property. That 100,000 cords of pulp wood would form part of the supply for a mill in the event of one being erected,

Tuesday morning the Haggarty interests purchased from Mr. John Murray, of Lake George, his lumber lands and mill at Lake George, including about 600 acres. The price paid is upwards of \$4,200.
