COPPERS.

NOT COOKED

Rose Pastor Phelps Stokes, in
an address on behalf of a New
York country-week charity, told
a quaint story.

"A little slum girl," she said
"stood for the first time in her
life in a barn-yard—a genuine,
old-fashioned barn-yard, with its
ricks, its lazy cows, its ploughs
and harrows and what-not."

"The slum child drank it all
in delightedly, then gasped,
half to herself;

"An jest look at the chickens
—all runnin' round raw!"

ROLLED BEEFSTEAK

Two pounds of round steak;
make good dressing as for turkey.
Spread over steak and roll up and
tie securely, put in a bag. Boil
2 hours; take out 15 minutes be-
fore serving, place in a pan and
brown in an oven.

CORN FRITTERS.

To the grated pulp of 4 ears
of corn add 1 egg, a little salt
and a very little flour, if necessary.
Mix together, and drop into the
frying pan containing a very little
lard or drippings. When done,
drain on brown paper to remove
any surplus fat.

COCOA PUDDING

Put 1 cupful of fine bread-
crumbs and 1 quart of milk in a
double boiler. When thick and
smooth, stir in 2 tablespoonfuls
of butter, 1 scant cupful of sugar,
2 tablespoonful cocoa and 1 tea-
spoonful of vanilla. Remove from
fire and beat 2 minutes. Add the
beaten yolks of 4 eggs; then the
whites beaten stiff. Pour into
baking dish. Place this in a pan
of water and bake 45 minutes.
Serve with a hard sauce or whip-
ped cream.

FRUIT PUFFS

One pint of flour, 1 teaspoon-
ful of baking powder, a little
salt and 1 tablespoonful of
cream. Add milk enough to
make a stiff batter. Put a table-
spoonful of this mixture into
buttered cups, then some cook-
ed fruit, another spoonful of
batter and steam 50 minutes.
Serve with sauce.

KEDGEREE

One pound of cooked fish, 1
cupful of rice, 1 tablespoonful of
butter, 2 eggs, pepper and salt.
Cut the fish in small pieces.
Wash the rice well and then cook
it in boiling water with a little
salt, let it boil for 20 minutes,
drain it dry, and let it steam
with a lid closely shut for 10
minutes without stirring. Boil
the eggs hard, take off the shells
and chop up the eggs finely.
Put into a clean saucepan the
fish, rice chopped eggs, butter,
pepper and salt to taste. Stir
all over the fire with a fork till
very hot.

OYSTERS AND MACARONI

Carefully look over and wash
1 pint of oysters. Cook 3-4 of a
cupful of macaroni, broken in 1-
inch pieces, in salted boiling water
drain. Put a layer of macaroni
in a small baking dish, then a
layer of oysters. Season and add
a little butter; repeat, and cover
with buttered breadcrumbs. Add
1-2 cupful of milk and sprinkle a
very little grated cheese on top.
Bake in a hot oven about 20 min-
utes.

WINTER CORN SALAD.

One dozen ears of sweet corn,
cut from the cob; one head cab-
bage, chopped fine; two stalks cel-
ery; four onions; four tablepoons-
ful mustard; two tablepoonsful
salt; three tablepoonsful flour; one
red pepper, cut fine; one cup brown
sugar; two quarts vinegar. Cook
one hour and seal.

THE BEST WOMAN.

Miss Susan B. Anthony, the social re-
former, had no more bitter opponent
than Horace Greeley, the famous editor
and journalist. It was for a long time
his custom to wind up all debates with
the conclusive remark: "The best wo-
men I know do not want to vote."

When the New York constitution was
being altered in 1867 Miss Anthony laid
a trap for him, says a biographer. She
wrote to Mrs. Greeley and persuaded
her not only to sign a petition herself
but to circulate the paper and get 300
signatures among her acquaintances.

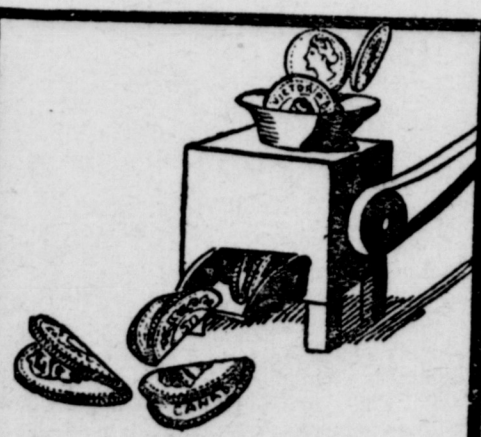
