**Household Hints**

**PEANUT DROP CAKES**

Remove shells and skins and  
finely chop one pint of peanuts,  
reserving twenty-four halves.  
There should be one-half cupful.  
Cream two tablespoonsful of but-  
ter, and add gradually, while stir-  
ring and beating constantly, one-  
fourth cupful of sugar; then add  
one egg, well beaten. Mix and  
sift one-half cupful of flour, one  
teaspoonful of baking powder,  
and one-fourth teaspoonful of salt.  
Add to first mixture, then add  
two tablespoonsful of milk, pre-  
pared peanuts, and one-half tea-  
spoonful of lemon juice. Drop  
from a teaspoon on an unbuttered  
tin sheet, one inch apart, and place  
one-half peanut on the centre of  
top of each. Bake twelve to fif-  
teen minutes in a slow oven.

**SIMPLE CHILL-SAUCE**

Eighteen large ripe tomatoes, 4  
green peppers, 6 large onions, 4  
cups vinegar, 3 tablespoons salt  
12 tablespoons sugar.  
Chop onions, tomatoes and  
peppers; add the other ingredients  
and boil until thick.—Woman's  
World for August.

**DRYING WASH DRESSES**

After the one-piece dress is  
ironed, a stick about 18 inches long  
should be inserted from shoulder  
to shoulder, and hung up by means  
of a looped cord tied in centre of  
stick.

**SAVE MATTING.**

To save your flannel matting  
make a cover of outing flannel to  
slip over your broom when sweep-  
ing. This will be found to take  
up the dust easily and saves the  
matting much wear.

**PREVENTS TARNISH**

To prevent brass fire sets from  
tarnishing cut a lemon in half, dip  
the cut parts in salt and rub the  
articles with these. Then polish  
with a chamois leather.

**BRAN FOR THE SKIN AND  
CLOTHES.**

Cheesecloth bags filled with bran  
are excellent for cleaning wall-  
paper. This is also better than soap  
for the bath tub and for the toi-  
let, nothing is better for the hands

**HOME-MADE SHOE TREES**

Take a pair of thick stocking

sawdust, and sew up the top so  
that the sawdust does not come  
out. When you take off your  
shoes put them on these shoe trees.  
The sawdust will absorb the pers-  
piration and keep the shoes in  
perfect shape. The sawdust can  
be changed when necessary.

**Famous Mosque In Peril Of Falling**

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 12.—  
The famous Mosque of Santa Soph-  
ia, built by Justinian in the sixth  
century, was considerably damag-  
ed, it is feared, by the recent earth-  
quake which shook European Tur-  
key.

Two years ago it was discovered  
that the huge dome of the mosque  
was forcing the supporting col-  
umns outward, and the line of the  
dome itself has been falling in.

Sir Francis Fox, who recently  
restored Winchester Cathedral, and  
Thomas G. Jackson, another well  
known English architect, who were  
consulted by the Turkish officials,  
placed strips of glass within the  
mosque as indicators in the event  
of the trouble spreading. These  
strips recently snapped, showing  
that the building again is moving.

LONDON, Sept. 12.—Sir Francis  
Fox, consulting engineer in West-  
minster and the city of London, in  
an interview today regarding the  
damage done by the recent earth-  
quake to the Mosque of Santa  
Sophia, at Constantinople, said un-  
less work of restoration was im-  
mediately undertaken the famous  
mosque was in imminent danger  
of collapsing.

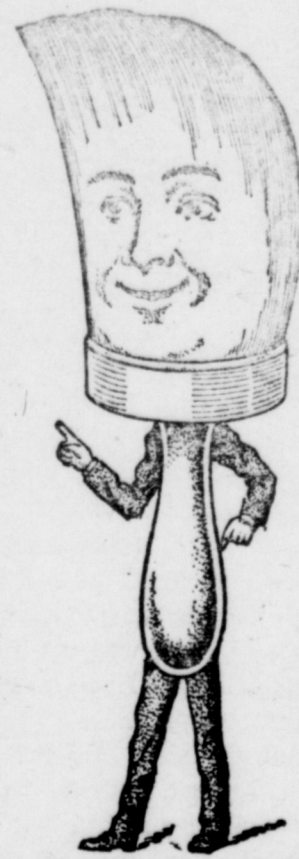
