PEANUT DROP CAKES

Remove shells and skins and finely chop one pint of peanuts, reserving twenty-four halves. There should be one-half cupful. Cream two tablespoonsful of bu'ter, and add gradually, while stirring and beating constantly, onefourth cupful of sugar; then add one egg, well beaten, Mix and sift one-half cupful of flour, one teaspoonful of baking powder, and one-fourth teaspoontul of salt. Add to first mixture, then add two tablespoonsfuls of milk, prepared peanuts, and on - half teaspoonful of lemon juice. Drop from a teaspoon on an unbuttered tin sheet, one inch apart, and place one-half peanut on the centre of top of each. Bake twelve to fifteen minutes in a slow oven.

SIMPLE CHILI-SAUCE

Eighteen large ripe tomatoes, green peppers, 6 large onions, cups vinegar, 3 tablespoons salt 12 tablespoons sugar.
