Swiss Cattle Canadas Need

The beef industry in Canada has shown a marked falling off in production in the past few years, and only last month a conference of Government authorities and ranchers was held at Winnipeg to discuss the crisis and consider means of preventing a serious meat famine. The reason advanced for the decrease in the number of steers raised is that farmers have found dairying more profitable, and have boug't ca the of the milking type to provide a constant flow for the creameries and cheese fac or.os. Those who have sought to remedy matters propose the general adoption of Shorthorn cattle of a good milking strain, which, while furpishing a comparatively good supply of milk, combine the requirements for the block. Many farmers, in Ontario particularly, have found this combination of utilities in the Shorthorn well worth while, but dairymen generally protest against the beef cow. Now comes the proposal that Canada import cattle from Switzerland. The bovines that graze in the valleys and on the slopes of the Alps are essentially dual-purpose cattle. According to Mr. Otto Herold of Bow Park Farm, in Brant county, who is a native of Germany, and well acquainted with agriculture on the continent. Swiss cattle are superior to the Shorthorns, both in beef requirements and milk flow. He declares that Swiss cattle alone can save Canada from the famine of beef hat now seems imminent .- Weeky Globe and Canadian Farmer.

#### Finds Means of Preventing The Suits Loss of Teeth

A SIMPLE FRYING TEST

As few cooks possess a fryometer, one or two simp's rules are given for testing the temperature of fat for frying. We often hear the expression "Fry in balling fat" but this is an error, for fit boils at a very high temperature and it would be impossible to cook anything in it at such a heat. When the fat is heated so that a faint clear vapor miy be seen rising from it, it is ready for cooking such things as crequettes, fishballs, etc., the ingredients of which have already been cooke 1.

A further test is to put a cube of bread into the hot fat. If this browns while forty is being counted, it is right for the purposes named above; but for uncooked iood --filets of fish, crullers, doughunt , etc .-- the bread should not brown until one can count sixty. If these foods were fried in fat as hot as that used for previously cooked mixtures, the out. side would brown before the inside was cooked.

Mr. Thomas W. Wilby, the pioneer of the Transcontinental road from Halifax to Vancouver, made a start from Halifa\* the other day and anticipates being Vancouver in 35 days' time. Mr. Wilby is accompanied by Driver F.V. Hanly, who was sent from St. Catharines, Ont, to drive the car, which is a Reo 30 H.P. five passenger touring car. The wheels of the motor were dipped into the waters of Halifax herbour, and a sample of the Atlantic was placed in a bottle to be carried the Pacific. The object of the tour is to interest the people of Canada in a national highway from Halifax to Vancouver. While there is a road over a good part of the distance, there are about 1,100 miles over which the only travel has been on horseback. ## Large Increase Of Deadly Drugs

Ottawa, Aug. 20 .- The importation of deadly narcotics into Canada this year, judging from figures for the first four months of the fiscal year, bids fair to largely exceed last year's importation. These drugs include cocaine, opium, crude and powdered, and morphine. high duty, in some cases almost a prohibitive duty. Despite that fact they continued to be imported in comparatively large quantities. The importation of cocaine alone for the first four months of the year has exceeded the import for he entire last year. For the first period of the present year 137 ounces have been imported at a value of \$317, as against 35 ounces, valued at \$88, for the entile fiscal year 1911-12. It is to

be noted that this is cocaine in its absolutely pure state; that used for dental and other purposes being very much compounded and diluted. Opium in the crude state, is also being imported largely. Already for the first four months of the fiecal year 993 pounds have been imported from Hong Kong and Turkey, valued at \$6,322. This, however, is a proportionate decrease over last year, when for the entire fiscal year 5,017 pounds valued at \$25,863, were imported. Of powdered opium for April May and June and July, 144 pounds, valued at \$948, were imported. The total imported last year was 355 pounds, valued at \$2,074.

The prohibitive duty on opium used for smoking purposes has entirely stopped the importation, not a single ounce having so far been brought in The importation of morphine also does not figure in this year's statistics so far. Last year 443 ounces of this drug valued at \$1,142, were imported for the entire fiscal year.

#### CLEANING HINTS.

Leather seats and leathercovered chairs may be cleaned by a thorough rubbing with a cloth dipped in alcohol and afterwards with one moistened with beaten yolk of an egg. Then polish with a flannel cloth and a nice gloss will appear.

To renovate feather pillows, place two boards across four cof ] fee-cans' and set in the bottom of the boiler. Pat enough water in the boiler to reach half-way up the cans, then place the pillows on the boards and place the cover on the boiler. Steam them thoroughly and dry them in the sun. This is an easy way to do a very ifficult task.
