Household Hints

WOULD "BURN" ALL RIGHT

**TOMATO FIGS OR CANDIED
TOMATOES**

For "figs" use the small yellow
tomatoes, allowing half the same
weight of sugar. Wash and place
a layer of them in the bottom of a
preserving kettle. Put over them
a thick layer of sugar. Use no
water, but let it simmer very gen-
tly over a slow fire until the sug-
ar is well absorbed, when care-
fully lift each tomato (singly) and
place on plates. Put to dry in
the sun, bringing in at night or
if rain threatens. They may be
dipped once more in the syrup
when dry and placed in the sun
as before. Granulated sugar must
be added once in a while during
the process of drying. When
quite free from moisture pack in
layers in jars, alternating with
layers of granulated sugar.

Hard on the Professor

Dr. Elwin A. Alderman, the
president of the University of Vir-
ginia, tells this story illustrating
the importance of being careful in
criticism.

"I know of a certain instructor
in rhetoric who always impressed
upon his students the necessity of
clarity in what they wrote. A

WYOMING'S WOMAN MAYOR.

The first woman Mayor in Wy-
oming, the first State to give wo-
men votes, was elected on an in-
dependent women's ticket, against
candidates of the Republicans and
Democrats. The new mayor, a
widow, by name, Mrs. Susie
Wissler, has issued a declaration
in which she has taken the stand
for "men's rights":

"I am not going to let the wo-
men impose on the men. Many
women are clamoring for immed-

many rights as women, and I am
not going to permit the women to
'run over' them.

"But I am going to enforce the
laws. The City Council, composed
of men alone, made the laws and
they will have to take their own
medicine. I have appointed a

who will not. If necessary, I
will appoint as marshal the most
rabid reformer in town."

It is declaration of independence
has met with State-wide favor,
and the execution of Mayor Wis-
sler's without-fear-or-favor policy
will be watched with interest far
beyond Wyoming's borders.




