Ottawa, Sept. 19—Marked increases in deposits and circulation, a decline in call loans outside Canada and a growth of those in Canada are conspicuous features of the August bank statement issued to-day. Current loans are about stationary in Canada, but those outside declined by two millions.


Allan Liner Took 9,500 Barrels Of Apples From Halifax
