PENNSYLVANIA WALNUT FUDGE

Two cups of sugar, cup milk, half cup cocoa, tablespoon corn syrup, butter half size of an egg; boil until it strings without stirring; then add teaspoon vanilla; have ready beat almost hard. black walnut meat and pour mixture over this. mark off in squares.

COOKING YOUNG CHICKENS

Open carefully down the back, clean and wipe out with damp cloth; lay open side down in a frying pan; add a little water; cover tightly; place on top of stove, cook until tender on that side; turo, season the cooked side with salt and bits of butter, and a suspicion of cayenne; cook until tender all through, adding a little more water if necessary, although it is better to let the water cook away toward the last, then pour in a little good cream; boil up and serve at once.

FRIED RICE

Pick over and wash one-half of a cupful of rice, put in a double boiler with one pint of milk and one-balf a teaspoonful of sal. Stir once or twice as the rice begins to swell and cook slowly until all the liquid is absorbed. Turn into a buttered dish or bowl and set away until cold. Cut in halfinch slices, dust with flour and fry in butter or sweet drippings.

no air may reach its contents. A screw top with rubber ring such as is used on preserving jars answers very well. If a cork be used this must be covered with grease-proof paper.

When all the jury are full they should be placed in a warm spot. If this be where the sun will shine on them, so much the better. The more sunlight they get the finer will be the perfume. They must be left for at least ten days or two weeks. Then the oil is drained off, pressing the cotton with a spoon and pouring the oil through a piece of fine muslin. This oil will be found to be highly perfumed. It should be stored away in tightly-stoppered bottles and kept for several weeks before opening.

The oil may be mixed with alcohol in proportion of about one part of oil to three or four parts of the spirit.
