## Record Apple Shipments From Halifax

Halifax, N. S., Sept. 27.—All records for apple exportation for this time of year will be broken tomorrow with the sailing of the Furness liner Michigan which leaves Halifax tomorrow afternoon with 17,000 barrels of apples on a special trip to Liverpool, the steamer having come from Boston for the purpose. The Kanawha left port shortly after midnight for London with over 16,000 barrels.

## The Outcome of a Practical Joke

Buffalo, Sept. 28.—Warren House who caused the death of Valentine Ludowski, a fellow workman, a few months ago, while playing a practical joke, will begin at once the serving of an unusual sentence imposed by Justice Marcus in the State Supreme Court here. The sentence places House in charge of a probation officer for an indefinite period, and compels him to pay \$3 a week toward the support of the family of the dead man, until the children are able to support their mother. ### Fine Weather For Threshing In The West

Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 27.—The fair weather continues throughout the West and threshing is in progress everywhere. From three to four weeks' favorable conditions will see the threshing completed. Winnipeg and its immediate district are so far untouched by frost and the gardens in this vicinity are still green.

### Messina Volcano Sprouting Lava From Nine Craters

Messina, Sept. 27.—The volcano Stromboli is again in eruption. Cinders, ashes and incandescent sand are being ejected from nine craters and dust is falling in quantities over the surrounding country and the outlying islands. Vineyards and crops generally were being heavily.

### Growing Seed Corn

It is a good plan to have a special seed patch and plant say twenty-five of the best ears in this patch. Each ear should be planted in a row without mixing with any other ear. Twenty-five rows planted in this way will be sufficient for the average farmer. At maturity, harvest each row separately and weigh the yields. Select the ears for next year's seed patch from the rows that give the highest yields, and the remaining portion of the rows of highest yield are used for planting the field crop. And so the work should be continued from year to year.

### People Panic Stricken

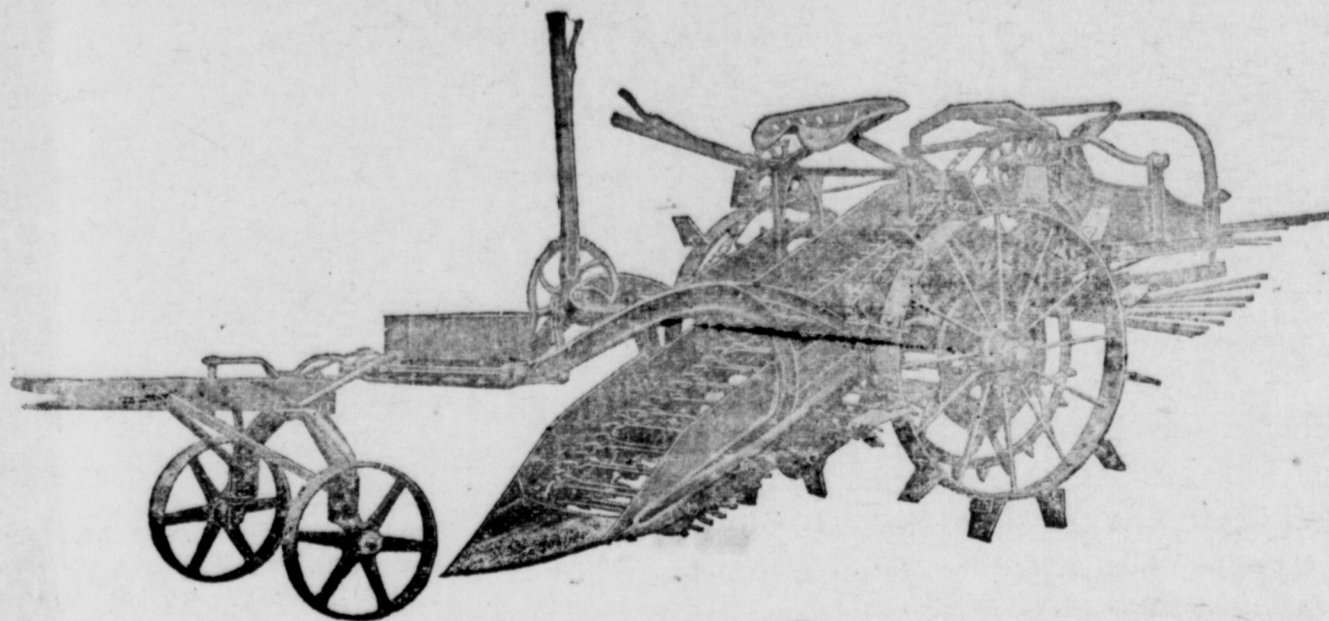
