DENATURED ALCOHOL FOR HOUSEKEEPING.

Hou ekeeping with denatured alcohol is advocated by a contemporary. It is claimed that for cooking it is cheaper and better than coal at present prices, and that much of the labor involved in caring for oil lamps is saved when alcohol is used as an illumi nant. An alcohol radiator may also be used satisfactorily for hea'ing rooms in spring and fall.

TO CLEAN OUT A CHIMNEY

When the stove ppes seem "choked up" and the fire refuse: to burn, the chimney is often very dirty. Lay a piece of z nc, old or new, on a bed of coals, and the fumes arising from the burning zinc will clean both pipe and chimney of all dust and soo".

COAL SHOULD NOT BE EX. CLUDED FROM AIR

Coal should be kept in a dry, airy place, and it will burn much better than if in a close, badly ventilated cellar. Coal that is ex cluded from the air soon gets rid of its gas, and the absence of this renders it more wasteful when burned.

STALE BREAD MADE FRESH

A stale loaf put into a closely covered tin, exposed for half an hour to a heat not exceeding that of boiling water, then taken out of the tin and allowed to cool, will be restored in appearance and properties to the state of new

Clover and Fertility.

Many farmers, says, Farm, Stock and Home, have the misaken notion that in order to build The finger marks on a door can up the fertility of their land they cow peas, or other legumes. So far, so good, but these same men will cut the clover, the alfalfa, or the peas for hay and depend upon the roots of these plants to put nitrogen into the soil. Experience, however, has shown that legumes place much of the nitrogen fixed by them from the air into their stalks and on'y a small portion in the nodules on the roots. In order for legumes to do their best n building up soil fertility they must be plowed under, root, stalk, and leaf.

S lo Best Form of Storing Corn.

There has been considerable work done by the Experimental Stations in determining the relative value of corn fodder and tion in the fodder and also in the what might be expected.

Good bright corn fodder in the early fall is a very appetizing and nutritious food for all classes of farm animals. The trouble with the stover is that unless it is carefully housed, loses anywhere from 25 to 40 per cent, of its feeding value from exposure. If it is cut up and put into the silo in the fall in the proper manner, it will be just as good next spring when grass comes as it was when put up in the fall, or perhaps a little better if any thing. The silo is certainly the most economical method of storing feed for all Service Bureau.


