Valley Railway Oromoeto Route,

Oromocto, N. P., Nov. 22-A petition was forwarded to Hon. J. D. Hazen, Minister of Marine and Fisheries, at Otta a last evening asking that the St. John Valley Railway be routed across the Oromocto flats by what is known as the front way.

The petition was in circulation for erhen River, Lake Saint Martin and the only three or four hours, but was er in seventy-nine hours, while the signed by practically every property same steamer taking the only available holder in the village and sets forth

that the front route across the flats would be the best for Oromocto and cause the slightest damage to property and vested interests here. The front route is also the shortest by upward of a mile.

Many are advocating that if the railway is bulit via what is known as the back route that it should be run down along the north bank of the Oromocto river past the village and thus not cut across the village as the survey made calls for the line after running down the south side of the Oromocto river, near the river bank, to cut across adjoining A. B. White's properth.

Canal.

London, z1-Despatches from Berlin anounce that the German government is giving serious consideration to a scheme to construct a canal linking he Rhine and the North Sea. Among several plans submitted the one that has met with the greatest favor is that which would start the canal at Weisdorf near Cologne, on the right bank of the Rhine, and run it parallel with the river as far as Duisburg, thence in a straight line to Ditzum, near Emden on the North Sea.

The whole length would be 174 miles, with an average depth of 23 feet and an average breadth of 148 feet. Its estimated cost is \$60,000,000, and its sponsors say it will allow Rhine steamers to reach ports in Northern England and Scandinavian countries much quicker than is now possible. It is calculated that the voyage from Cologne to Emden and back by the new canal could easily be made by the ordinary Rhine steam route, via Rott rda , now takes 132.
