Non-Conformist Can Receive D.D. Degree At Cambridge Now

Cambridge, Eng., 22.—A step of immense importance to Non-

Conformists was taken by the university senate here today when it agreed by a vote of 435 against 326 to rescind the regulation debaring the conferment of the degree of doctor of divinity on Non-Conformists.

Explosions in non-union iron works in Milwaukee, Wis., Omaha, Neb., and in Springfield, Mass., were explained by Ortie E. McManigal at the "Dynamite Conspiracy" trial, Friday, as having been done by him shortly before he and James B. McNamara arrived in Detroit to "clean up" that city, where they were arrested with suit cases filled with dynamite. He and McNamara talked of their suspicion that they were being followed and of blowing up W. J. Burns. Seven days later they were arrested. The American Federation of Labor has decided to ask affiliated unions to assist in the defence of the alleged dynamiters to give them a fair trial.

Unearth Plot To Kill Kaiser

Madrid, Nov. 23.—The sensational discovery was made today that Manuel Pardinaz Zarrate, the assassin of Premier Canalejas, was but one instrument in an anarchistic plot which also embraced the killing of Emperor William of Germany.

Following this discovery the German secret service police have been notified to keep a close watch on all foreigners in Berlin.

A special guard has been kept over King Alfonso and Gen. Weyler ever since the killing of Canalejas as their lives were also threatened.

Quebec, Nov. 23.—It is probable that an attempt will be made to-morrow afternoon, at high tide, to float the steamer Royal George. It is not likely that tugs will be used at the first attempt, but the ship's own anchors. Three of these have been placed out aft and one at the bow. If the tide reaches a certain height the ship's winches will be set in motion to haul

in the cables and pull the steamer into deep water. The tide will be high between 5 and 6 p. m.
