#### Household Hints

ENGLISH TEA BISCUITS.

To 1 cup hot mashed potato add 1-2 cup sugar and 1 yeast cake dissolved in 1-2 cup lukewarm water. Cover and let rise; then add 1-2 cup each of butter and sugar, 2 eggs well beaten, 1 teaspoon of salt and 3 1 4 cups flour. Knead, again let rise, shape, let rise, brush over with sugar and bake in a moderate oven. Add, if liked, 1-2 cup raisins cut in pieces, cr currants.

#### POTATO PUFF.

Prepare two cups hot mashed potatoes. Add half cup milk, two well-beaten yolks, two tablesp o is butter, pepper and salt to taste. Beat well, add beaten whites of two eggs. Pile lightly in buttered baking dish and bake in quick oven until puffed and brown.

#### OPERA CARAMELS WITH FRUIT

Put 2 cups light brown sugar and 7-8 cup cream into a saucepan, bring to boiling point and let boil until it forms a soft ball when tried in cold water. Turn onto a marble slab, cool slightly, then stir with a spatula, until crear y. Add 1-2 cup raisins, spread in a pan, let stand until cold, then cut in squares on marble slab.

#### BLACK SATIN STOCK COLLARS

Black satin stocks, which have been out of date for several seasons, are with us once more, and they are seen in a great variety of styles. A straight collar, or one made of folds of the material, may be trimmed with tabs, crossed loops, a four-in-hand tie, or merely buttons, or it may be finished with a flat pump bow. The little turnover collars of lace or embroidery formerly seen on such stocks are not used now, though they may come in later. Some of the black satin stocks have a space of about two inches in front made of white lace, set in transparent with a lace jubot below. Black satin collars, either high and ro!. ling or flat and round are very much used with a white jabot. Sometimes the jabot consists of an inchwide band of black satin, with a pleating of white or cream lace on each side in length reaching to the waist. Similar jubots are made in shorter lengths, the pleating being brought in a point around the lower end, the central band being either satin or velvet.

COFFEE STAINS ON LINEN.

To clean coffee-stained linen soak in cold water to which has been added a little borax. All coffee, chocolate, tea and fruit stains will disappear if boiling water be poured over and through the spot before the linen is washed. It is best to do this whlie the stain is fresh and damp.
