Household Hints

If brooms are dipped into a pail
of hot suds for a minute or two
once a week, it will make them
tough and pliable, and they last
much longer.

Old fly specks can be removed
by a solution composed of equal
parts of skimmed milk and water
warmed.

In putting down linoleum or
oilcloth have strips of moulding
nailed above the linoleum where
it comes to the base boards. This
prevents dust from getting under-
neath and also preserves the edges
from moisture under floor cover-
ing.

Try washing of the hands with
a little sugar added to the soap.
This greatly increases the lather
and cleansing power, and will
remove dirt and chemical stains
in a wonderful manner.

BEEF PICKLES.

Use small red beets, boil till
tender, skin. Slice the larger ones.
Put in Mason jars, leaving 2-in
space at top. Fill with boiling
syrup made in proportion of 1
pint cider vinegar to 3 pounds
light brown sugar, containing a
few whole cloves and sticks of cin-
namon. Let the cans stand 15
minutes, until beets are heated.
Pour syrup off, heat quickly and
return to beets in the cans. Fas-
ten tops as usual. Do not punc-
ture skin of uncooked beets.

**HAIRPIN KEEPS LAMP GLASS
FROM CRACKING.**

Another use has been found
for the invaluable wire hairpin.
Hung over the top of a lamp chim-
ney, it prevents the heat, when
the lamp is lighted, from cracking
the glass. This is on the same
principle as putting a silver table-
spoon in a glass jar when filling
it with hot fruit.

CANNING STRING BEANS.

One peck of beans such as you
would use for "snaps" string and
break into inch lengths; add
enough water to cover, a handful
of salt and a cupful of good vine-
gar; put over the fire and let come
to a boil; keep boiling ten minutes
then pack into jars use new rub-
bers and cover beans to overflow-
ing with the water and vinegar,
and seal, air-tight. Wrap in
brown paper and put away in a
cool place.

Another way is to prepare your
beans as for the table; break into
short lengths and pack closely in
glass jars, then fill to overflowing
with cold water; screw on the
covers, and have a wash boiler
with slats or a thick cloth over
the bottom, and stand your jars
on this; fill with cold water in the
boiler, enough to cover the jars;
put boiler over the fire; boil con-
stantly for three hours, having the
cover on the boiler, if the water
seems too much evaporated, fill
again with boiling water from the
tea-kettle. Let jars stand in the
water until cool, then tighten the
tops as much as possible, stand
on top end to test for leakage,
and if perfectly sealed, wrap in
brown paper and put away.

CANNING CORN.

Nine pints of corn cut from the
cob; one pint of sugar; half pint
of salt; one pint of water; mix
and let stand a few minutes until
the juice rises to nearly cover the
corn, then boil twenty minutes
and seal in glass or tin jars while
boiling hot. To prepare for use,
soak and drain off the water un-
til just salt enough; then season
with a little butter and cream
thickened with a spoonful of
flour; sweeten if liked.

McNamara Disobeys The Prison Rules

San Yenten, July 18.—After a week
in solitary confinement J. R. McNamara
one of the convicted dynamiters of the
Los Angeles Times building, stubbornly
refused to conform to prison discipline
and Warden Hoyle said today he would
be kept in the dungeon indefinitely. Mc-
Namara was placed in solitary confine-
ment a week ago when he refused to
obey an order given by a guard in the
Jute mill. He had been punished before
for insubordination and Warden Hoyle
ordered he be put in the dark cell.
"McNamara's punishment was the re-
sult of repeated acts of insubordination,"
said Warden Hoyle. "He has been a
persistent violator of prison rules and
there was nothing for us to do but to
take extreme measures." Warden
Hoyle denied a rumor that McNamara
had been involved in a plot to burn the
ute Mill.
