

Servia to Get a Commercial Port.

London, Dec. 19-The Belgrade correspondent of the Daily Mail sends the following: "I learn that the Austro-Servian dispute has been solved. Servia will recognize an autonomous Albania, receiving the use of a commercial port on the Albanian coast, connect ed with Servia by a neutral railway. The Servian minister of r ilways is leaving Belgrade for London for the purpose of giving technical advise to the Servian peace delegates."

London, Dec. 19-Whether peace is to be declared between Turkey and the Balkan allies or whe her the war is to be continued is expected to be settled within forty-eight hours. In diplomatic circles in London the opinion prevails that if the thorny obstaclewhich are likely to present themselves at the sessions of the peace conferences in St. James Palace today and to-morrow, can be surmounted or circumvented peace will be assured.

EBST INDIAN DRAWN-WORK

East Indian drawn-work makes a pretty finish for towels and pillow-cases, and can be used as a substitute for the ordinary drawn work. It has also the advantage of not causing the eyestrain that is inseparable srom pulling a large number of threads The results of the work are similar in effect to punch work, but the process itself is quite d ff rent. The effect is got by using a large needle and fine thread, and doing the work on the wrong side of the cloth.

For a towel, draw one thread at the top of the hem to serve as guide in keeping the work straight but do not turn the hem. Use number fotry sewing-cotton and rge-sized punch-needle. Hold the towel in such a way that the hem part is in the left hand. Take four threads of the towel on the needle, holding the thread under the thumb as in a buttonhole stitch, and draw the thread firm. Do this twice with every four

CANDY PUDDING FOR CHRISTMAS.

Grind in a meat chopper a halfcupful each of shelled nuts, best seeded raisins, figs, dates, cocoanut, candied cherries and candied pineapple, and a very small amount of citron. Spread the ingredients on the centre of a large marble slab. Boil together two cupfuls of sugar, the milk of a cocoanut, half a thimbleful of salt, half a thimble of soda, two tablespoonfuls of cream, and one tablespoonful of butter, with just enough water to cover them.

When the mixture "threade," or seems hard enough to handle upon being dropped into cold water. remove it from the fire and pour it over the chopped fruit. Stir it constantly with two forks until it is celd enough to knead. Work the mixture until it is smooth and well blended, press it into equare, shallow pans, and leave it there until it is perfectly cold. Cut it into pieces to fit small pasteboard boxes, and wrap it in oiled paper. Wrap the loxes in scarlet paper. and tie them with holly ribbor.
