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Screws and nails that have be come rusted in wood may be easily removed by allowing a small quantity of kerosene oil to soak into the wood around them. After a short time has elapsed they can be removed without any trouble.

When marking linen, first write the name with a common lead pencil, then mark over the pencil with the marking-ink. You will find that the pencil will prevent the ink from spreading and looking unsightly, as is so often the case.

Castors slipping out of furniture often cause a busy housekeeper a good deal of annoyance. This may easily be avoided by winding rubber bands around the shanks of the castors before slip ping them into the sockets, A good band will last a long time, and, may easily be replaced after the rubber has worn out.
